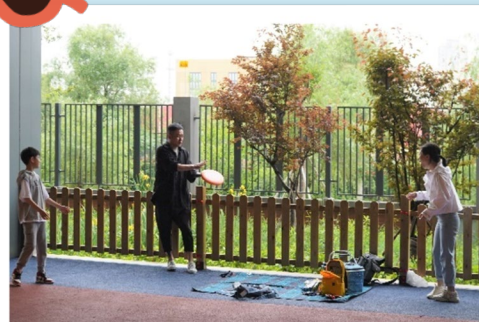


## PTA Potluck Picnic Day

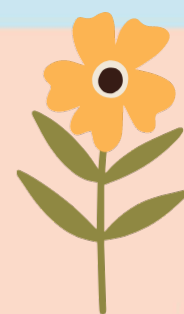
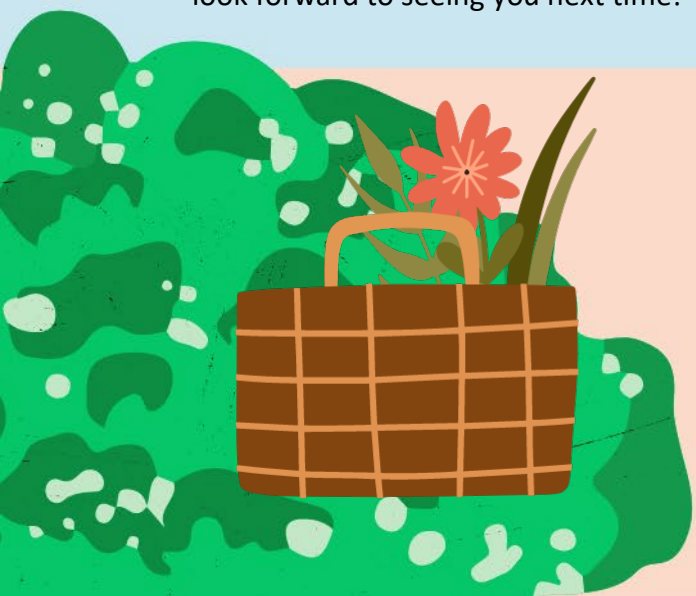

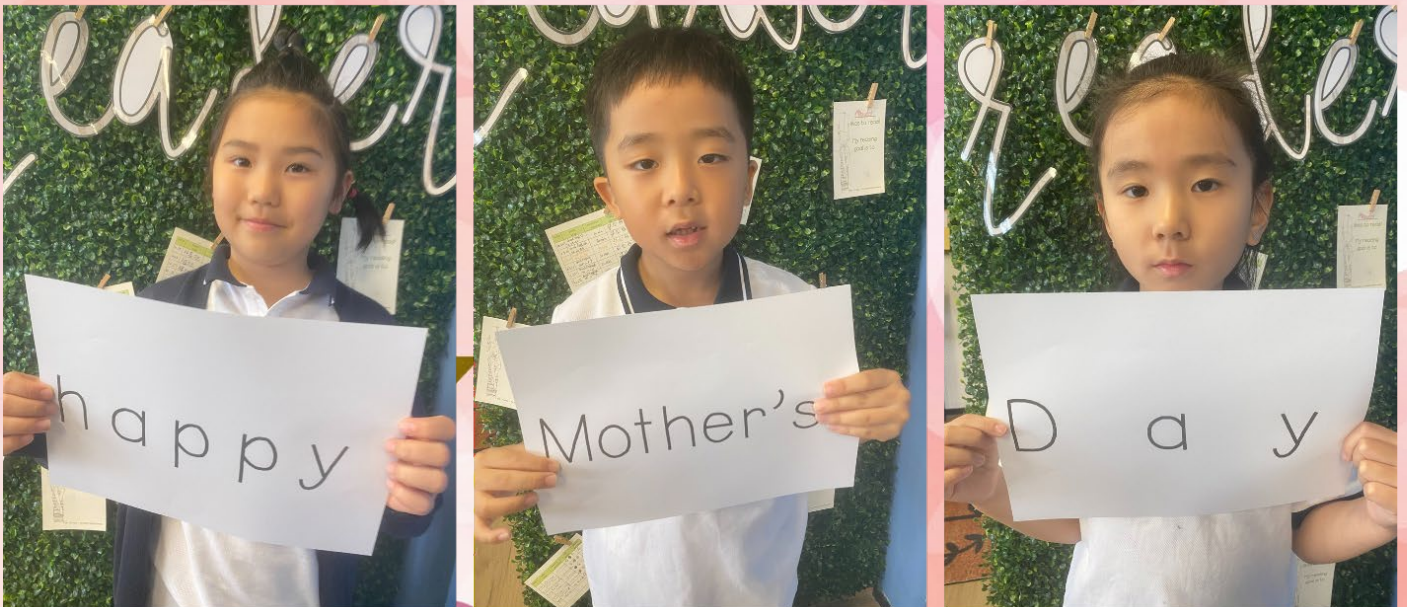
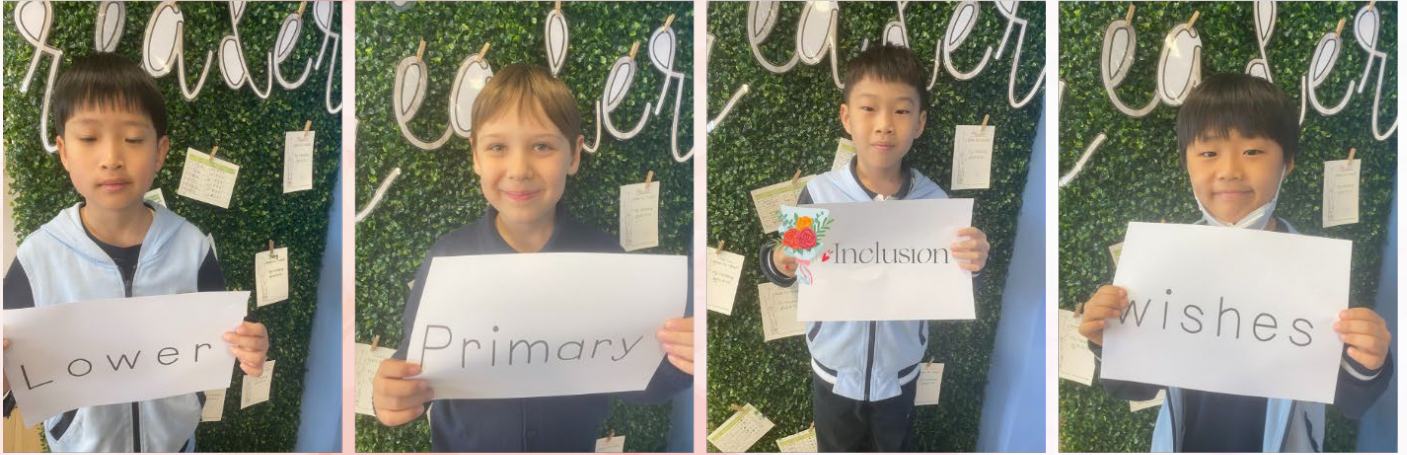
# YEAR 1B *Plants*

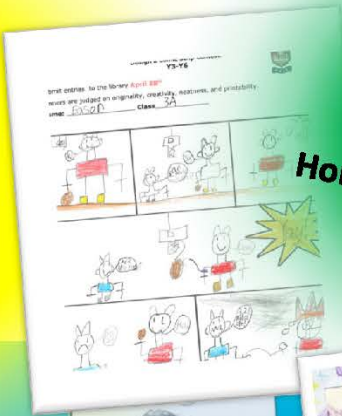

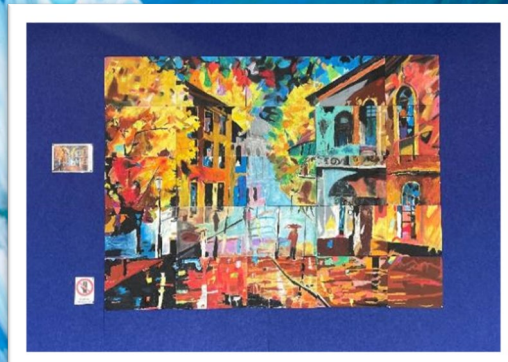
# Year 7's New Artwork Is On The New Pinboard Walls Now!

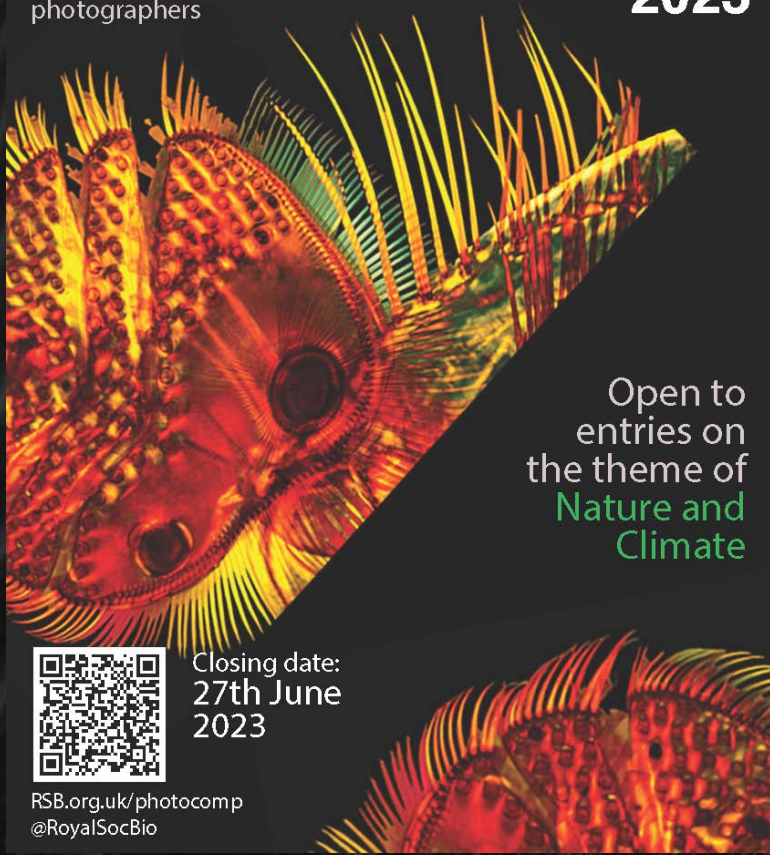

**1. Approval minutes last meeting**

Approved by all SAC members.

**2. Managing Sensitive Communication**

Specific matters of teacher conduct were discussed, and SAC is satisfied that the issues raised have been managed competently and professionally by the school. Matters of SAC Member conduct were also discussed and understanding established regarding the standards required for professional and respectful communication. All reaffirm the message given to students by the Principal on Tuesday May 2<sup>nd</sup>:

Students are growing up in a highly complex and challenging environment in which they need guidance and support from home and school. We want all students to be safe and happy at school. Students must understand that they are able to speak to trusted adults if they feel uncomfortable or concerned



about their experience at school. Parents, teachers, counsellors are all available to listen and support. We must recognise the power of rumour to ruin a life. It's not a joke. All must exercise caution when hearing rumours. Unsubstantiated reports should not be passed on as facts. Rumourmongering should not be used to ridicule, threaten or bully others.

### **3. Update Review Group SAC Constitution**

The reviewed draft has been shared to SAC members in advance. The documents were reviewed until Article 8 (Office Holders and Executive Committee), revisions have been agreed.

### **4. Feedback Sports & PE facilities**

A short report has been provided prior to meeting. Phil thanked for the report and he believe the requirements have been delivered to school very clear. SAC would be able to make suggestions of material investments and facilities improvement to complete what schools already plan for summer rebuilding.

### **5. CIS update**

As a Member School, NBIS is heading into the next phase - Accreditation. In order to determine whether schools are ready to take on the challenge of an extremely robust Self Study, CIS conducts a Preparatory Evaluation Visit (virtual or actual) in which the School Evaluation Officers assess to what extent the basic components of a good international school are in place. On Wednesday May 17, the two principals Phil and Rob, Head of Primary Kash, and Deputy Head of Admin Sharon will attend an online workshop for a better understanding of the standards for the Preparatory Evaluation Visit. The New International Principal Nancy will join online from Nanning.

**Appendix 1:**

**INFORMATION ABOUT OPTIONS AT NBIS**

IGCSE courses are 2 years long and studied in Y10+11. Students sit the exams in May/June of the second year.

There are 35 periods of 45 minutes in our weekly timetable: 7 lessons per day.

At NBIS a number of subjects are compulsory in Y10+11

1. Maths (exam subject 5 lessons per week)
2. English (exam subject 6 lessons per week)
3. Chinese (exam subject 4 lessons per week)
4. PE (non-exam subject 3 lessons per week)
5. Homeroom/Assembly is 1 lesson per week

TOTAL = 19 LESSONS

Students can then choose 4 from a range of additional exam subjects, each having 4 lessons. Students are advised that it's in their interests to do at least 1 science. But finally, the choice is with the student and parent.

1. ICT
2. Physics
3. Chemistry
4. Biology
5. History
6. World Literature
7. Art and Design
8. Drama
9. Travel and Tourism
10. Business Studies
11. Global Perspectives
12. Music
13. Marine Science
14. Additional English (non-exam)

In Year 9 Semester 2, students are advised about pathways to university and informed about groups of subjects which would normally complement each other. They are also surveyed about their preferences so that the school can optimise the choice that students have. Based on the data, the 14 subjects are then placed into 4 or 5 blocks with students asked to choose 1 from each of 4 different blocks. Normally, a minimum of 5 students is required to make a subject run.

All this information is disclosed to students and parents with time for discussion. From year to year, the options may change a little and the blocks will be formed to match student preferences with staff competencies.

Note that in recent years, we have added: ICT, Travel and Tourism. Business Studies, Global Perspectives, and this year, Music and Marine Science to the exam subject options. In 2024-25, we plan to add PE.

Additional English is there for students whose English Language competency is insufficient to manage the full range of subjects. With the help of this class, they will be able to take 6 rather than 7 IGCSE subjects successfully.

As a relatively small school, we are probably at the limit of the number of subjects we are able to offer through the traditional method. There may in the future be opportunities to offer subjects online with supervision or even using personal AI coaching. But such courses might attract additional expense.

In Years 12+13, students follow the Cambridge A-Level Programme.

At the end of Year 11, students must choose which subjects to study. The determining factors should be:

1. Competence and Readiness: A 'C' at IGCSE is normally required as evidence that a student has the tools to manage the subject at A-Level.
2. Enjoyment: A-Level is intense and to a large degree determines the pathway for future study. Students must really enjoy the subject.
3. University requirements: Subjects chosen at A-Level should correspond to the requirements to register in specific courses at university.
4. Aspirations: Student goals for the field of future employment

A-Level subjects normally require a minimum of 6 lessons per week. This year we have added Further English (non-exam) as a compulsory course for students whose academic English language competence is low ... to support them in their main subjects, and Business Maths (non-examination) for students whose pathway requires 4 years of High School Maths, but not necessarily at examination level.



Year 12: Advanced Subsidiary Level

Students will normally choose 4 subjects at AS Level. Particularly gifted students may study 5.

No examination subjects are mandatory. PE is not formally offered. Global Perspectives and Music are not offered at A-Level. However, Psychology is added to the list of options available.

So, for example, a student may choose Maths, Physics, Chemistry and Business Studies: 24 lessons. + 1 Homeroom lesson = 25 lessons. The student will have 10 lessons per week for private/independent study. A student studying 5 subjects would have 30 lessons per week + 1 Homeroom lesson = 31 lessons; and therefore only 4 lessons per week for private/independent study.

Year 13: A2

Students will normally study 3 subjects at A2 Level. They would normally drop their weakest subject. Gifted students may study 4. This means that students have additional private/independent study time in Y13. This is excellent preparation for university life in which students are often entirely responsible for their own learning.

Universities around the world accept 3 A-Levels for entrance to most courses. Universities will place conditions on students ... For example, you must score minimum A, B, B. Some universities, seeing the potential of a student may offer unconditional entry. That means they really want to enrol the student.

Note that from Y10 onwards, students are introduced to the SAT (Scholastic Aptitude Test) required by most universities in the USA and students are able to take the test at NBIS as many times as they wish until they graduate in order to get the highest score. So far, very few students have chosen this option.

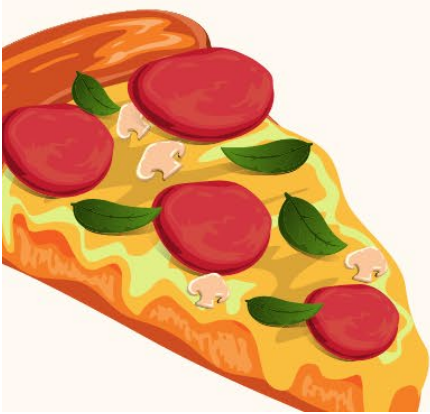
Note that NBIS has chosen to make PE compulsory up to Y11 in line with our belief that exercise, learning basic anatomy and physiology, practising teamwork, building personal fitness, exploring the components of a healthy lifestyle are essential ingredients for balanced student development.

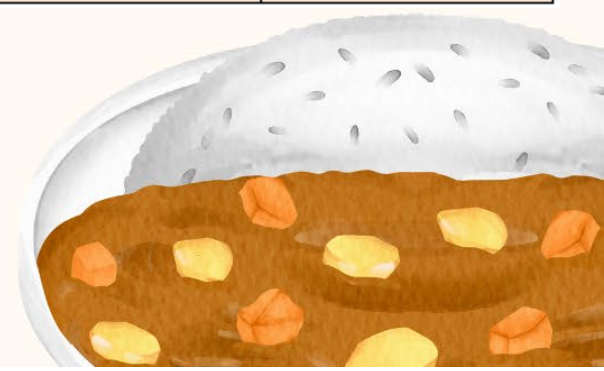
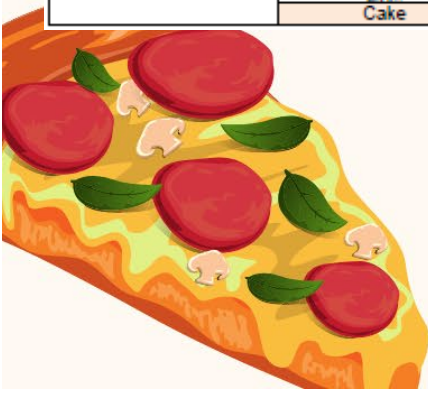
