# Professor Mao Haiying of Ningbo University delivered a lecture on "The Development of the TEP Model for Teaching Chinese Culture and its Implementation at Ningbo University" to our educators

On the afternoon of April 17th, our institution had the privilege of hosting Professor Mao Haiying, the Head of the International Chinese Pedagogy Department at the College of Humanities and Media, Ningbo University, who delivered a lecture on "The Development of the TEP Model for Teaching Chinese Culture and its Implementation at Ningbo University" in our school's auditorium.



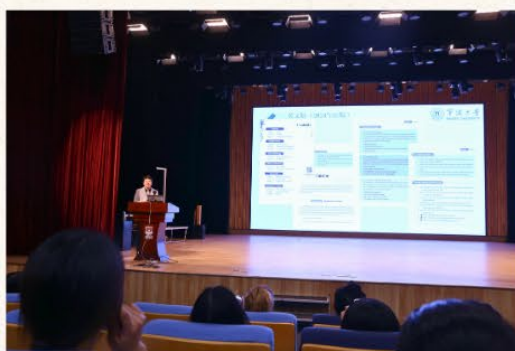
The seminar was attended by all Chinese educators. Ms Nancy Eldars, the International Principal, and Mr Robert Yan, the Chinese Principal, were present to engage. The event was chaired by Ms Emily Zhang, the Head of the Chinese Department.



Professor Mao Haiying expounded the lecture's content from three perspectives: the context of cultural reciprocity and the introduction of the TEP model; the essence of the TEP model and its Implementation at Ningbo University; and the practical significance of the TEP model in fostering international Chinese talent development.

During the lecture, Professor Mao Haiying elaborated on the structure and essence of the TEP (Teaching, Experience, Practice) model for teaching Chinese culture, and divulged the accomplishments of the current TEP model in the education of international students and master's degree candidates in the Department of International Chinese Education at Ningbo University. Concurrently, Professor Mao Haiying showcased the book "An Overview of Chinese Culture" (edited by herself), presenting a comprehensive account of the book's content, framework, supportive resources, and application.

Following the lecture, Professor Mao Haiying engaged in a 15-minute interactive Q&A session with the educators. In response to the educators' inquiries, Professor Mao provided comprehensive responses individually. Concluding the session, Professor Mao Haiying expressed her enthusiasm as an international Chinese educator, and warmly encouraged the emerging generation of Chinese language teachers to effectively tell Chinese stories and spread the good voice of China.

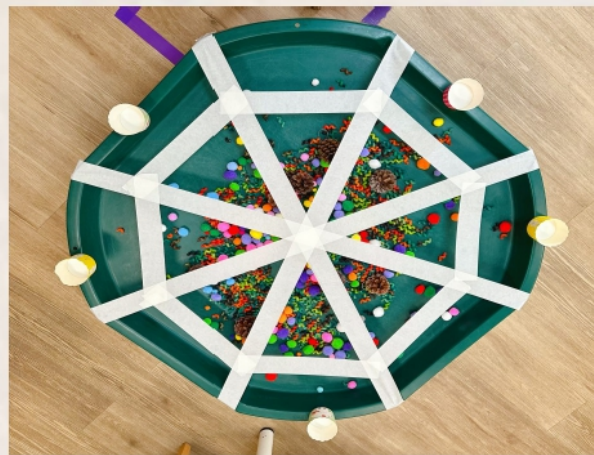


# Nursery A

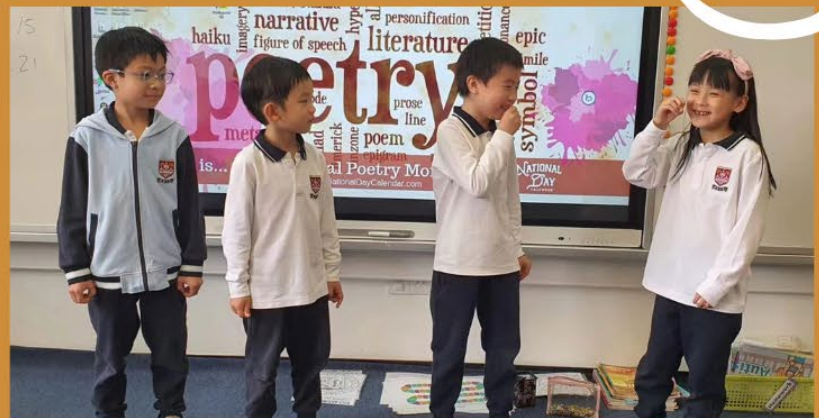

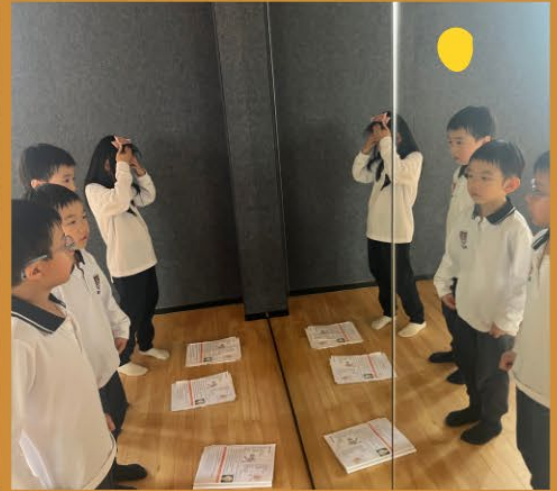

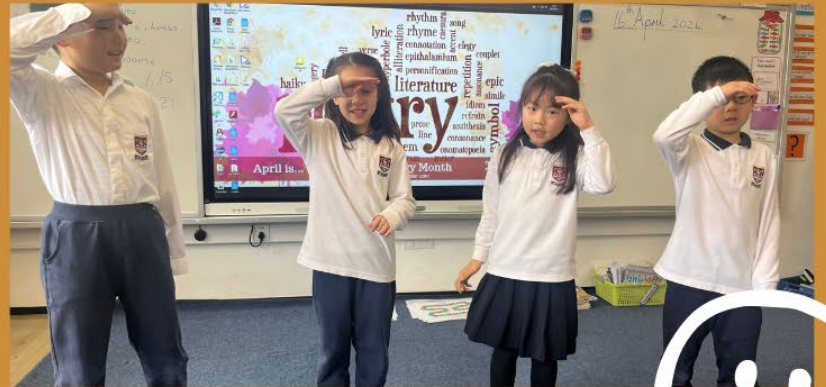

<b>1</b>	<b>Welcome</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The Chair of SAC Rosaria welcomed everyone and introduced the meeting agenda.</li> </ul>
<b>2</b>	<b>Principal's update on staffing and recruitment</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Four qualified new teachers have been recruited for 2024/2025 – Primary ESL Teacher, Secondary English and Humanities Teacher, EY Teacher and Primary Teacher.</li> <li>A Bilingual University Counsellor has been interviewed and has moved to the second round of the recruitment process.</li> <li>SLT has completed successful internal middle leadership interviews in Primary who will be taking on further responsibilities and joining the Head of Primary, driving development and continuing towards excellence. Five Middle Leaders have been appointed and further training is planned for the start of 2024/2025; Lower Primary Co-ordinator, Upper Primary Co-ordinator, English Subject Lead, Maths Support Lead, Phonics and Reading Lead.</li> <li>The school continues to search for an SEN specialist. With one SEN specialist, the school is currently recruiting an SEN coordinator. SAC expressed hope that Secondary will have a dedicated SEN specialist at the earliest opportunity.</li> </ul>
<b>3</b>	<b>Elevate SAC's commitment to the community and accessibility</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The SAC email needs to be more publicly accessible and visible. The email must be added to the NBIS weekly Newsletter.</li> <li>Committee members suggested a video shoot for the SAC committee members to reach out to NBIS families informing them of the impact and intentions of the committee, thus encouraging more families to engage with SAC members on building a more robust NBIS community and support the growth and development of NBIS.</li> </ul>
<b>4</b>	<b>Supporting a positive work environment at NBIS</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Currently, a survey is being prepared by SLT to seek input from NBIS staff on school life. SLT seeks feedback and input from staff to drive positive development across the school by responding to feedback in a meaningful and targeted manner. Surveys help staff reflect on their involvement in the education process, and the school community and support senior leaders on taking action on development. A staff survey will be sent out soon.</li> </ul>
<b>5</b>	<b>Make the school more public to NBIS families</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>SAC members suggested that now that the special measures of the last three years are over, the school needs to become more open and welcoming to NBIS families as previous to 2020.</li> </ul>

This adjustment is necessary to sustain and uphold high teaching and learning standards and maintain NBIS's unwavering commitment to excellence.</li> <li>SAC members recommend future increases in the tuition fee to be by a fixed amount rather than a percentage and propose aligning the fees to minimise disparities.
