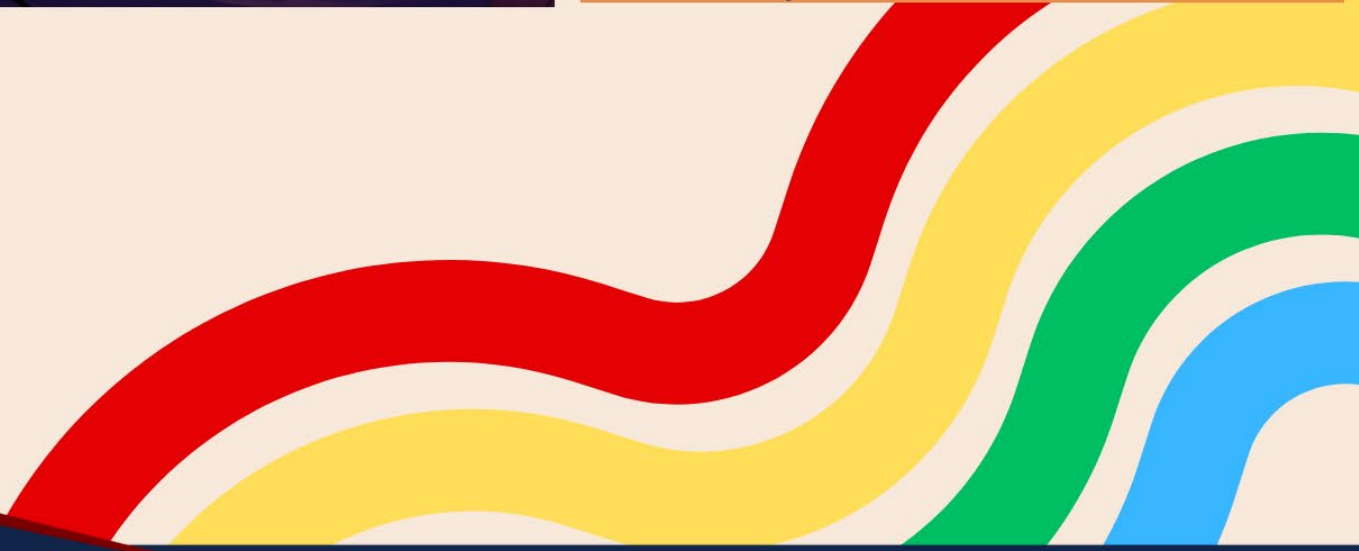
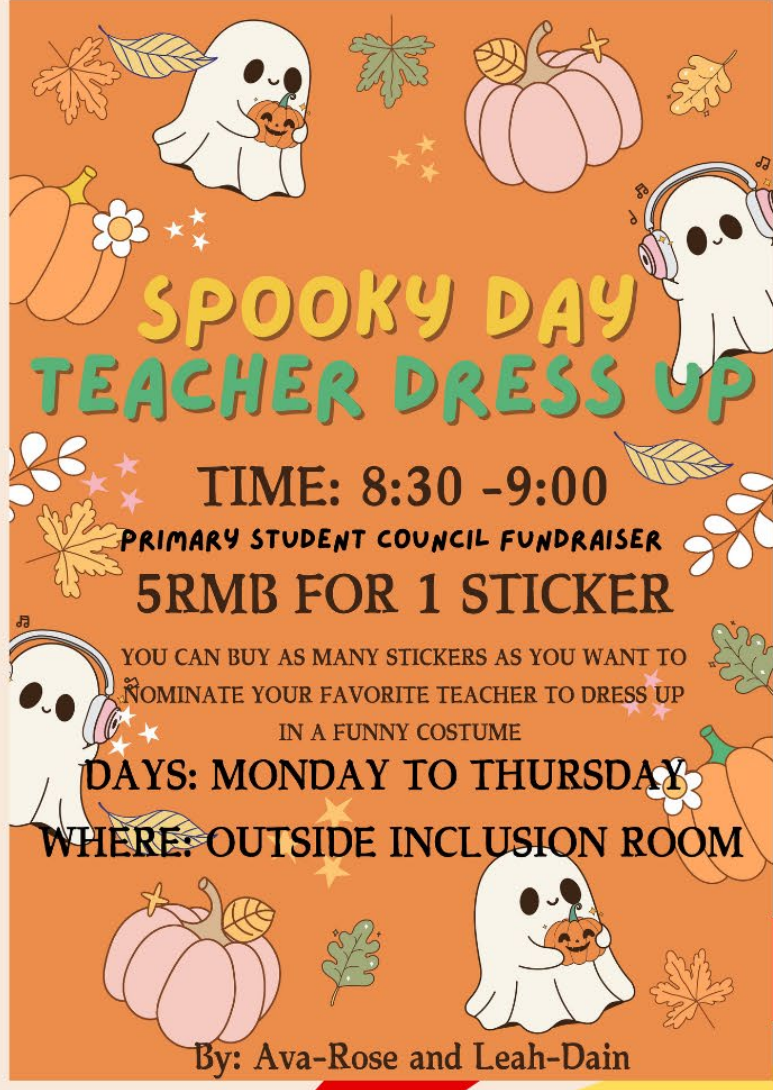
Our classroom is a safe and supportive environment where students can feel comfortable to ask questions, make mistakes, and learn from each other.

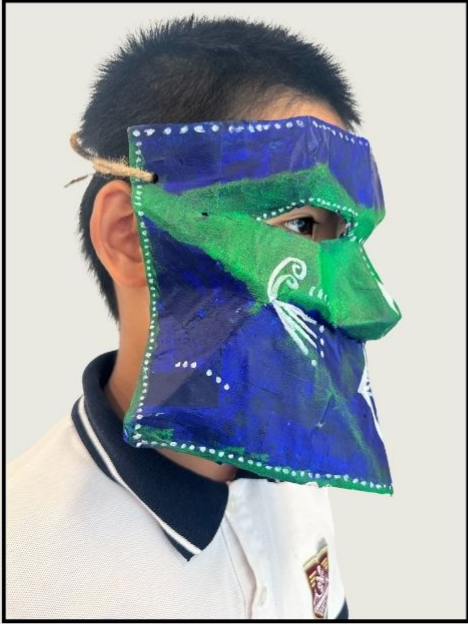


In art class, students delved into the rich history of Venetian masks, learning about their cultural significance during Carnival and their evolution over centuries. They explored the symbolism behind various mask designs, such as the Bauta, Zanni, and Joker, and how these masks were used for anonymity, social satire, and theatrical performances. Inspired by this tradition, students created their own paper masks, first constructing a base design and then applying layers of papier-mâché to give the masks form and durability. Once dried, they painted their masks with vibrant colors and patterns, emulating the intricate details of traditional Venetian masks. To finish, students used pens to add fine decorative elements, bringing their unique creations to life while reflecting on the history they studied.

These kinds of projects encourage hands-on learning and show students that their creative ideas can come to life in a digital space.

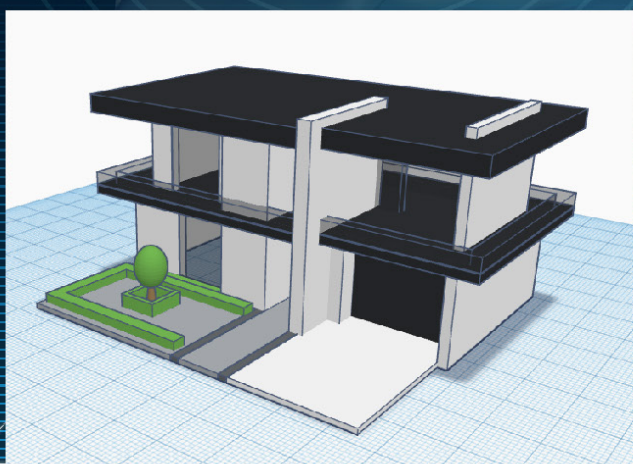
## PREPARING FOR THE FUTURE

At NBIS, we are proud to offer our students the opportunity to learn cutting-edge skills that will serve them in the future.

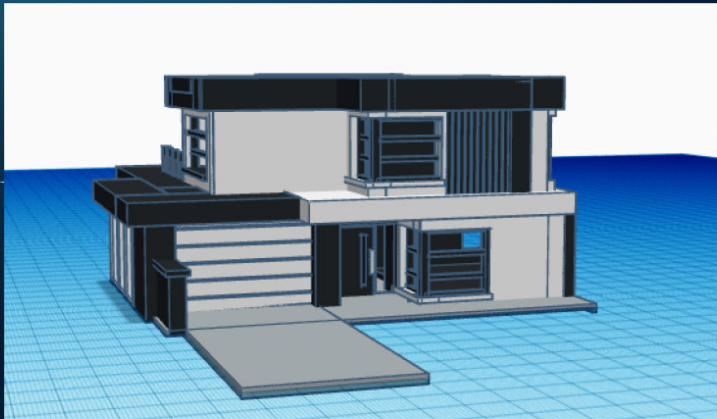
