NBIS Year 3A Student Shines in Fencing Tournament

Congratulations to Amanda Shen from Y3A has achieved first place in both the Under-8 Girls' Individual and Team Foil Fencing categories at the 2024 Taizhou Youth Fencing Tournament!!

Warmest congratulations to Amanda for her incredible accomplishment and for surpassing her own limits in such a challenging competition.



Reflecting on her journey, Amanda shared her excitement and nerves leading up to the event. Although she has been practicing fencing for three years and has participated in several tournaments, this was her first time taking home two gold medals. As one of the younger competitors in the U8 category, Amanda faced opponents who were mostly older and more experienced. "Most of the other fencers were taller than me and older than me, which made it feel like a real challenge. I was surprised and so happy to win," Amanda said. "My family was also amazed by my achievement. They are all very proud of me."



The semi-finals were especially tough for Amanda, where she faced a previous bronze medalist from the Zhejiang Province Youth Fencing Championships. Having lost to this opponent in the past, Amanda felt the pressure but rose to the occasion. Trailing 7-9, Amanda made an incredible comeback, scoring three points in a row to secure a 10-9 victory and advance to the finals.

When asked about her inspiration, Amanda said, "Lee Kiefer (USA) and Marini Tommaso (Italy) are my favorite athletes; they were both Olympic fencers. I wish one day I can compete in the Olympics and showcase my fencing skills." Amanda's hard work and ambition are truly inspiring, and we look forward to seeing what she will achieve in the future!

NBIS Year 8A Student Stands Out in Climbing Tournament



Congratulations to Lachlan Zhuo from Y8A for achieving 1st place in both the Under-13 Men's Individual and All-round categories in rock climbing at the 2024 National Youth U Series Climbing Tournament!

You may recall that back in April, Lachlan won 2nd place in the U13 difficulty category at the National Youth Climbing Open Competition held in Jiangshan, Zhejiang. Recently, he has achieved even greater success, shining once again with his impressive performance.

Lachlan has been involved in climbing since Year 2 and has 5-6 years of experience now. His current V Scale rating has reached V7, which is considered advanced. This level demands significant strength, flexibility, and technique from climbers, with movements often being more complex and requiring precision. Some routes may even require one-arm support, dynamic moves, or challenging balance techniques.

Climbing tests a competitor's technical skills, physical condition, and mental resilience. Lachlan believes the most challenging aspect is maintaining a positive mindset. He emphasizes the importance of overcoming nervousness, calmly planning his route, evaluating its feasibility, and ultimately completing the challenge. Fortunately, Lachlan has a great attitude—he stays relaxed and enjoys the competition. "The moment I reach the top after completing a route makes me happy," Lachlan said.

This year, Lachlan aims to participate in adult-level competitions as a youth competitor, allowing him to tackle even more challenging routes.

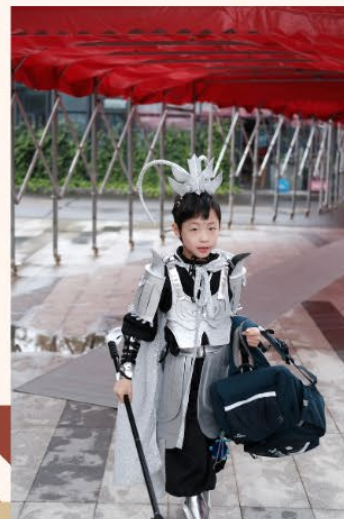

The show will be presented on Sunday, the 10th of November.

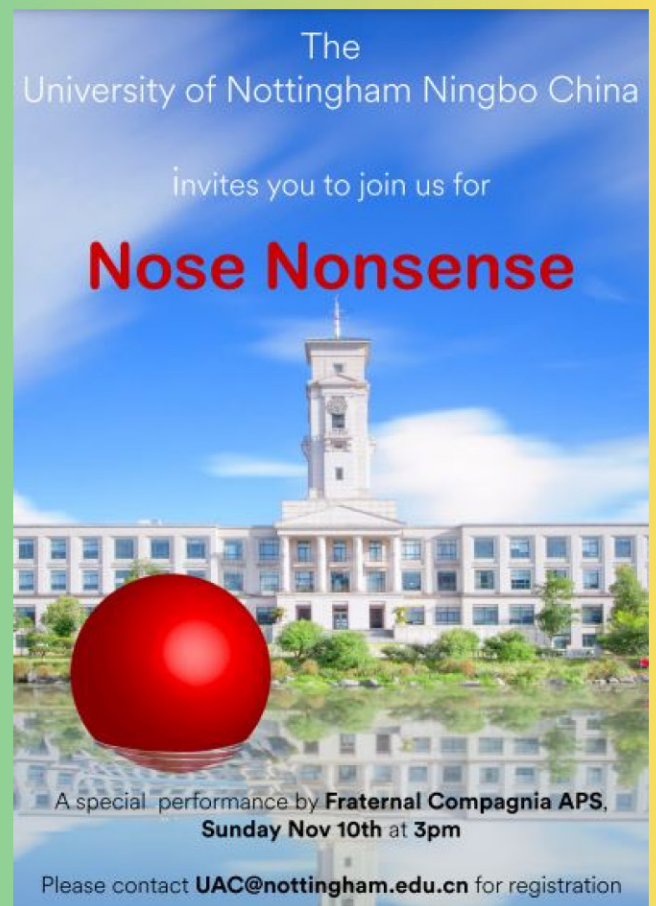
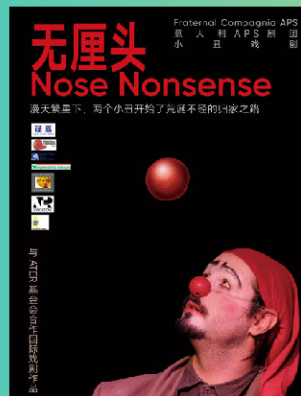

Early Years Section



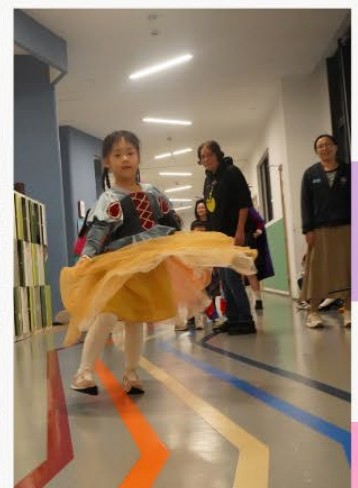

UN DAY

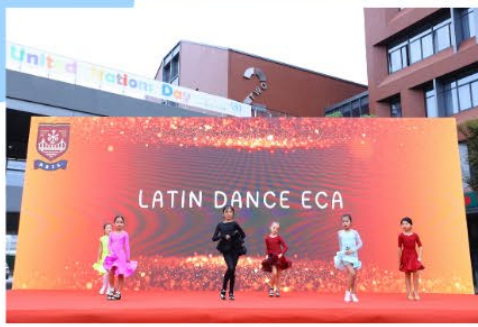
