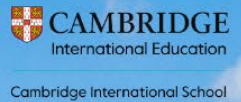

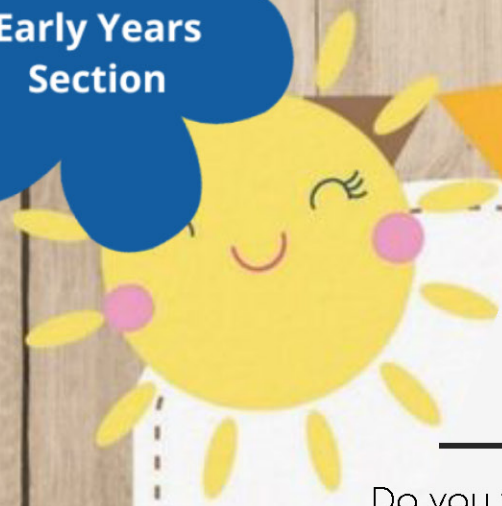

Another of our activities saw many students experiencing roller skating for the first time! This new skill helped improve their balance and coordination and fostered their confidence as they supported each other in trying something new.



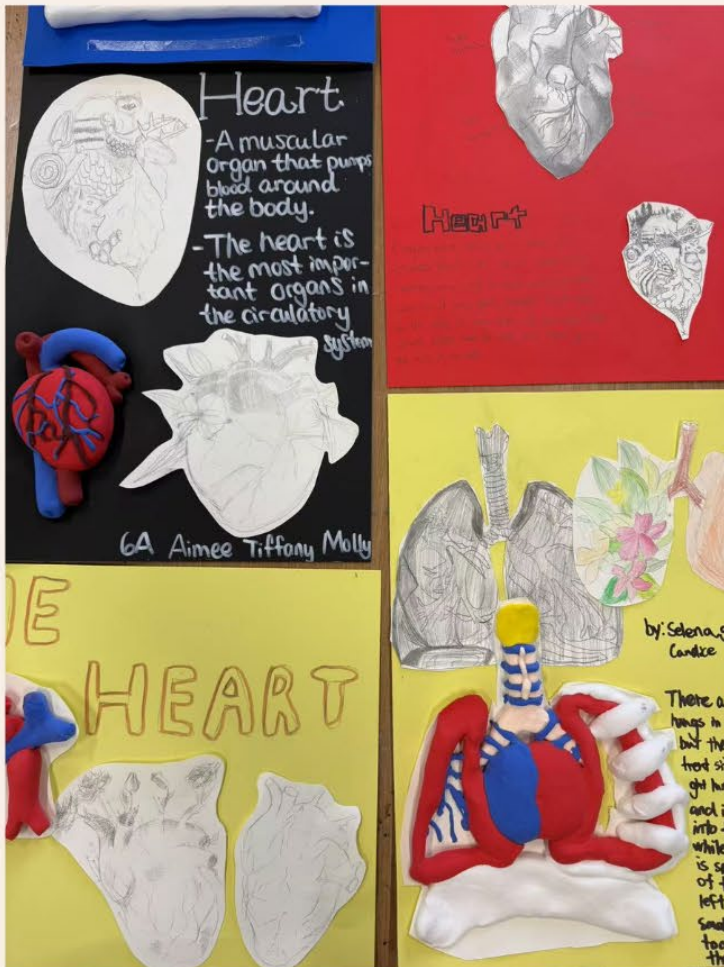

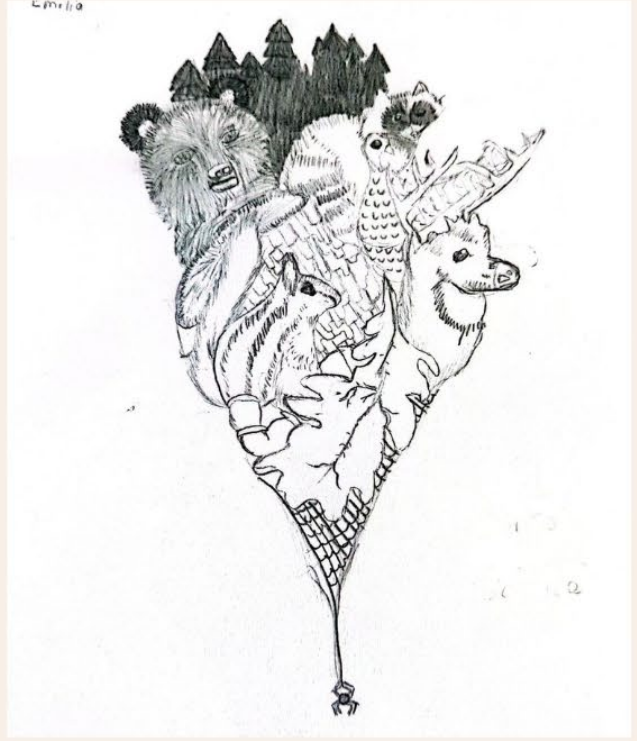
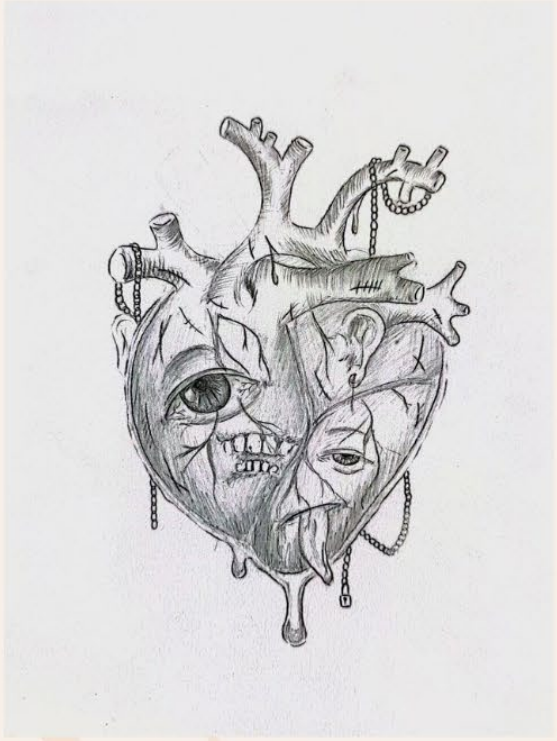
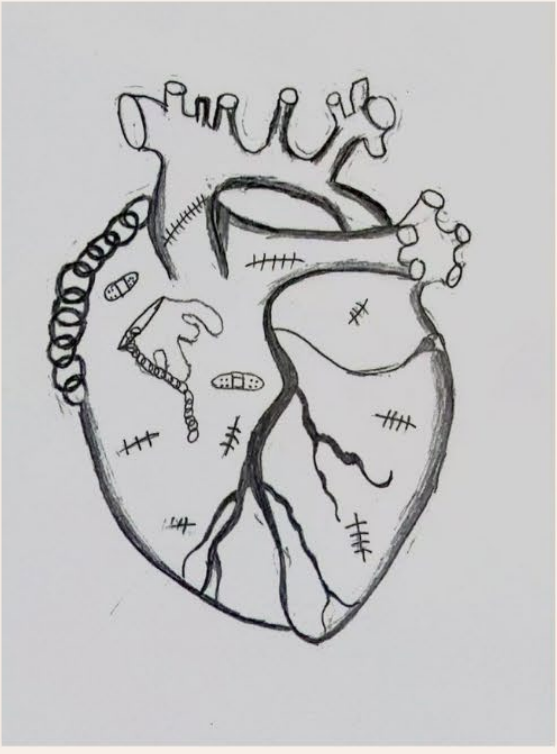


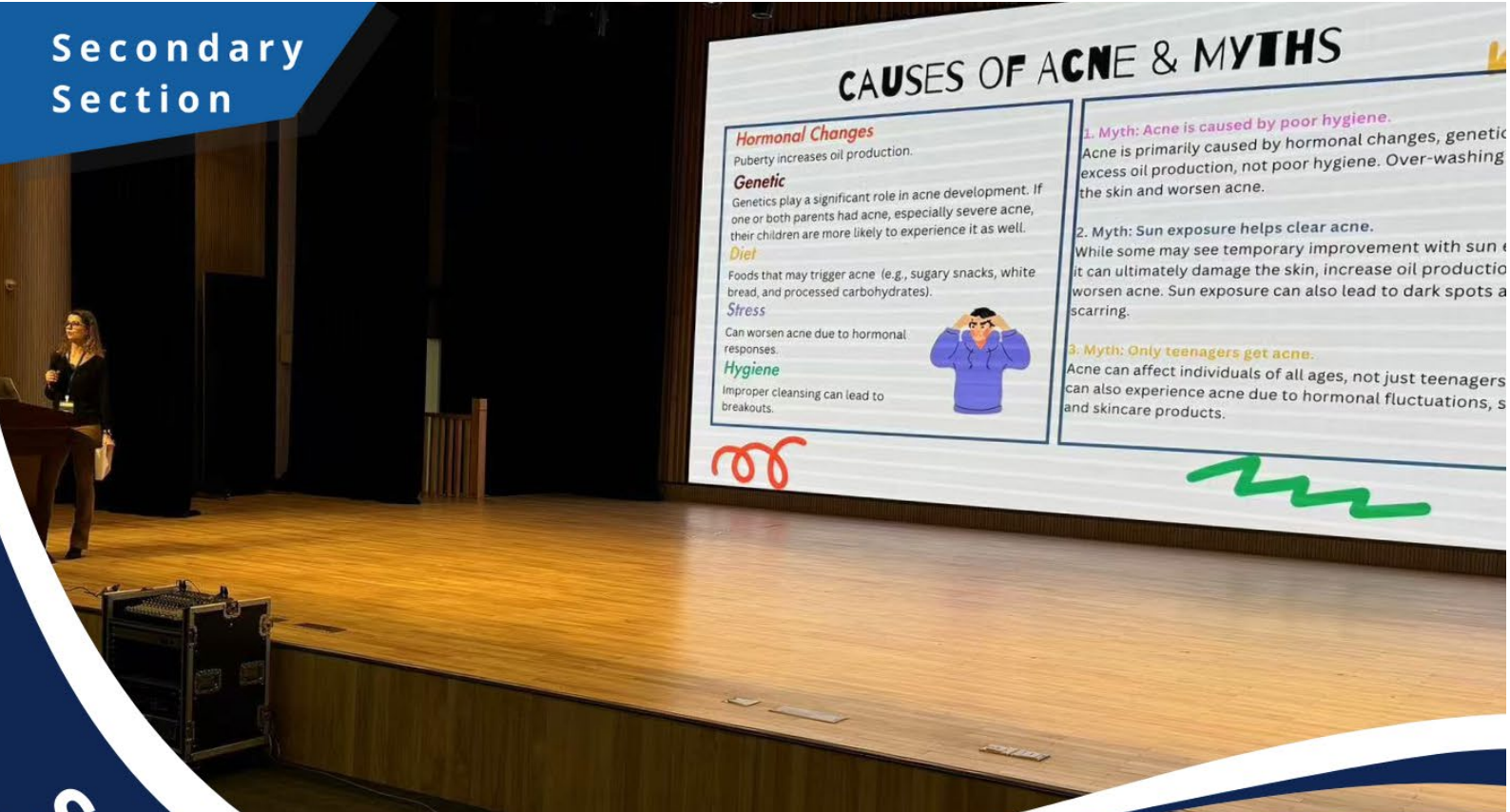
Art of the Week

Throughout the academic year, the Expressive Art department offers a variety of extracurricular activities, such as lunch breaks, after-school sessions, and competitions.

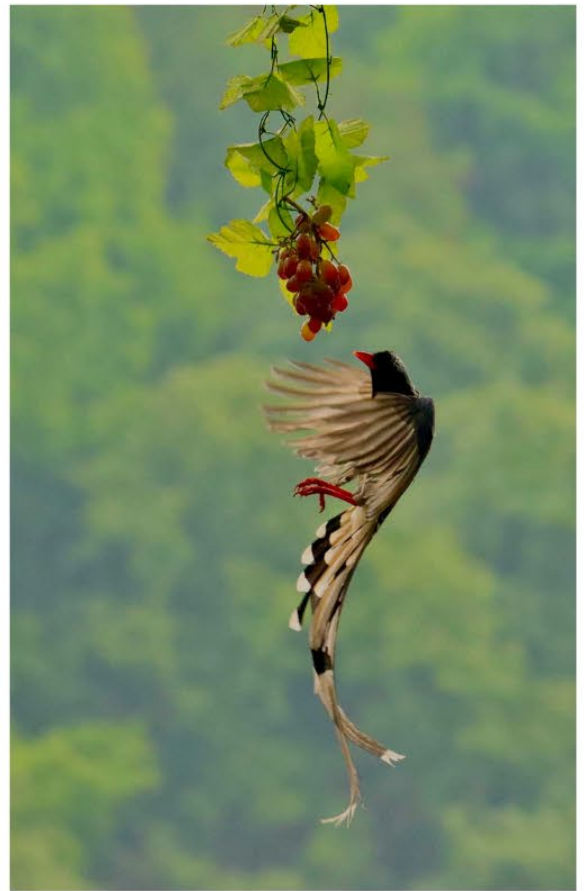

A spectacular and inspiring week at NBIS!

Artists in residence, workshops, mask exhibition, shows and competitions.

This semester, we celebrated Expressive Arts at NBIS with our very first Drama Week! This has been a unique series of events organised with 3 Italian drama artists who came for a China tour and to spend this week with us!

The theatre company we invited specialises in Commedia dell’Arte, a comedic Italian tradition that was born in the 16th century with the aim of entertaining people while keeping a critical eye on society.

Half masks are a central feature of this theatre genre, which makes it even more meaningful in an educational setting. In fact, in Drama, masks are not something behind what to hide but an opportunity to find new freedom of expression.

During the week, students from Primary and Secondary had the chance to experiment with masks and practical activities led by the theatre artists.

The Students' Perspective on the Workshop:

Despite some nervousness facing professional actors for the first time, the workshop turned out to be a unique and energising experience that will not be forgotten by any participant. It was a wonderful introduction to the world of Commedia dell'Arte, a traditional Italian masked theatre form originating from the sixteenth century.



We started off with some intensive improvisation exercises that worked on our ability to project our voice and enhance our reaction speed. The actors were incredibly open, welcoming, and clear with a good sense of humour when explaining to us each character's traits represented by the masks. They were very considerate when guiding us on how to get into the characters of the four main characters, Arlecchino, Pantalone, Il Capitano, and Dottore. Overall, it was a rare and inspiring opportunity that we are all very grateful for.

The Teachers' Experience

Staff were invited to attend a Commedia dell'Arte workshop, led by the professional Italian comedy troupe consisting of Tania Passarini, Luca Comastri and Gabriel Bird. An amazing and rare opportunity for staff to experience quintessential Italian culture and theatre in an intimate way and enrich their professional relationships.



The group started with some simple team building and warm-up exercises. The Drama room was filled with laughter, activity and warm spirits.

Then, staff were given a master class on how to act as two of the Commedia dell'Arte characters: Pantalone and Il Capitano. Walking in short, penguin-like steps with hunched backs and extended necks, the room was filled with a crowd the aged and miserly Pantalones. Staff shuffled around the room with the stiff, jerky movements they had been taught while eyeing each other with suspicion and muttered complaints. Mr Dani volunteered to participate in a masterclass exhibition of Pantalone's character. He shuffled both hauntingly and comedically around the theatrical space.



Then, staff were taught about Il Capitano; the captain character. Full of bravado and false confidence, staff members marched around the theatrical space with chests puffed out and heads held up high. As instructed, at the slightest noise or unexpected movement they would jump in cowardice. Mr Armstrong dashed behind the stage curtain, while Mr Aaron attempted to hide underneath a piano with great comedic and physical effect. Finally, Mr Isidro donned the authentic, hand-made Commedia dell'Arte mask in a special Il Capitano demonstration for the group, to much laughter and applause.

Finally, full of companionship towards each other, staff members split into two groups. Each was given one of the troupe's hand-made masks to wear and embodied the characters they represented. They put on two special performances for each other. "The Museum" and "The Chairs". What exactly happened in these special performances? Well, that will forever remain a secret between the members of the workshop...

A huge thank you to Tania, Luca and Gabriel for sharing their expertise and passion with our school, and especially to Ms Nausicaa for organizing and facilitating such incredible opportunities for both staff and pupils.

Mask Exhibition

Students were wowed by a visit from the Italian comedy troupe “Fraternal Compagnia”, hailing from Bologna, Italy. This professional Comedie dell’Arte group sent waves of hysterical giggles and excitement around the NBIS auditorium as the Primary and Secondary students watched their show.

Students were taken on a theatrical tour of historic Italian society and culture, meeting characters such as Il Capitano (the best captain in the world!), Pantalone (a miserly, old merchant, driven by greed and foolishness), the original Harlequin and many more.

The comedy troupe used all of their skill in acting, music, presenting and storytelling to bring the characters to life. An amazing and rare opportunity for our pupils to celebrate.

Ningbo International Drama Festival

NBIS welcomed a more versatile group of talented performers on Friday, November 8th 2024, for the fifth installment of the regular International Drama Festival held at the school. The spectators enjoyed a wide range of thrilling performances, the entertainment factor traditionally high on both the more light-hearted, comedy-based numbers and the more serious, thought-provoking ones with a big gamut of time periods and dramatic styles presented on stage.



This year's edition saw five schools competing, the biggest number of educational institutions to join the event until now. There were performers from NBIS, NBHIS, HD, AIAN, and UNNCAHS. Earlier that week Ms Nausicaa, the main organizer and the flag carrier of the event, had invited a troupe of Italian comedy actors to present some pieces from the popular Italian Comedia dell'Arte current in front of NBIS audience, and they were only too glad to also participate as judges for the Drama Festival. This talented trio comprised Mr Gabriel Bird, a prominent member of the Geneva Drama English Society; Mr Luca Comastri, a professional actor, director and playwright at two prestigious schools, Teatro Colli (Italy) and Lois Jouvet (France); and Ms Tania Passarini, an expert creator of masks and a professional teacher in physical and masked theatre. The fourth member of the jury was provided by University of Nottingham Ningbo China (UNNC) in the face of Mr Derek Irwin, an Associate Dean of Education & Student Experience at the university, and an actor/director in numerous drama plays in the UK, Malaysia and China.



Secondary Section



All students came very well prepared for the occasion, with a substantial number of performances dedicated to the serious, mind-stimulating aspect of life, with themes ranging from turbulent relationships (“A View from the Bridge”) to inner psychological and emotional torment (“Lucid Dream”), to serious family issues (“Hedda Gabler”). The deep gravity of these numbers were deftly balanced by the more humorous, more uplifting repertoire which contained hilarious outbursts of criticism (“Ubu”), sizzling artistic differences (“The Sunshine Boys”) colliding, issues of bullying/rudeness represented in an overtly comic fashion (“Pay Up”), and even unusual, surreal situations (“Mr. Egg”) bordering on the absurd. Needless to add, the father of all things Drama William Shakespeare was covered with dexterity, with all aspects of his output paid tribute, the comedies (“As You Like It”), the tragedies (“Romeo & Juliet”, “Macbeth”), and the blends between the two (“The Merchant of Venice”).



A successful dramedy (“Goodbye Charles”), a mixture of comedy and tragedy, is also worth mentioning, as well as pieces that also involved other skills outside strict acting, like the song-infused “Call Your Name”, and the short but effective ballet etude featured on “When I Grow Up”. Apart from Shakespeare, other classics were also paid respect like Lewis Carroll’s “Alice in Wonderland”, and two works of the eminent contemporary playwright Neil Simon (“Come Blow Your Horn”, “The Sunshine Boys”), these numbers handled with good understanding of the time period in which the works were created, and with the appropriate attention to both executional and situational detail. The diversity of topics and themes was really big, requiring a wide range of skills on the side of the young actors during their time on stage, their inspired performances keeping the audience fully entertained for nearly two hours.

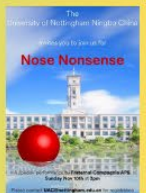
