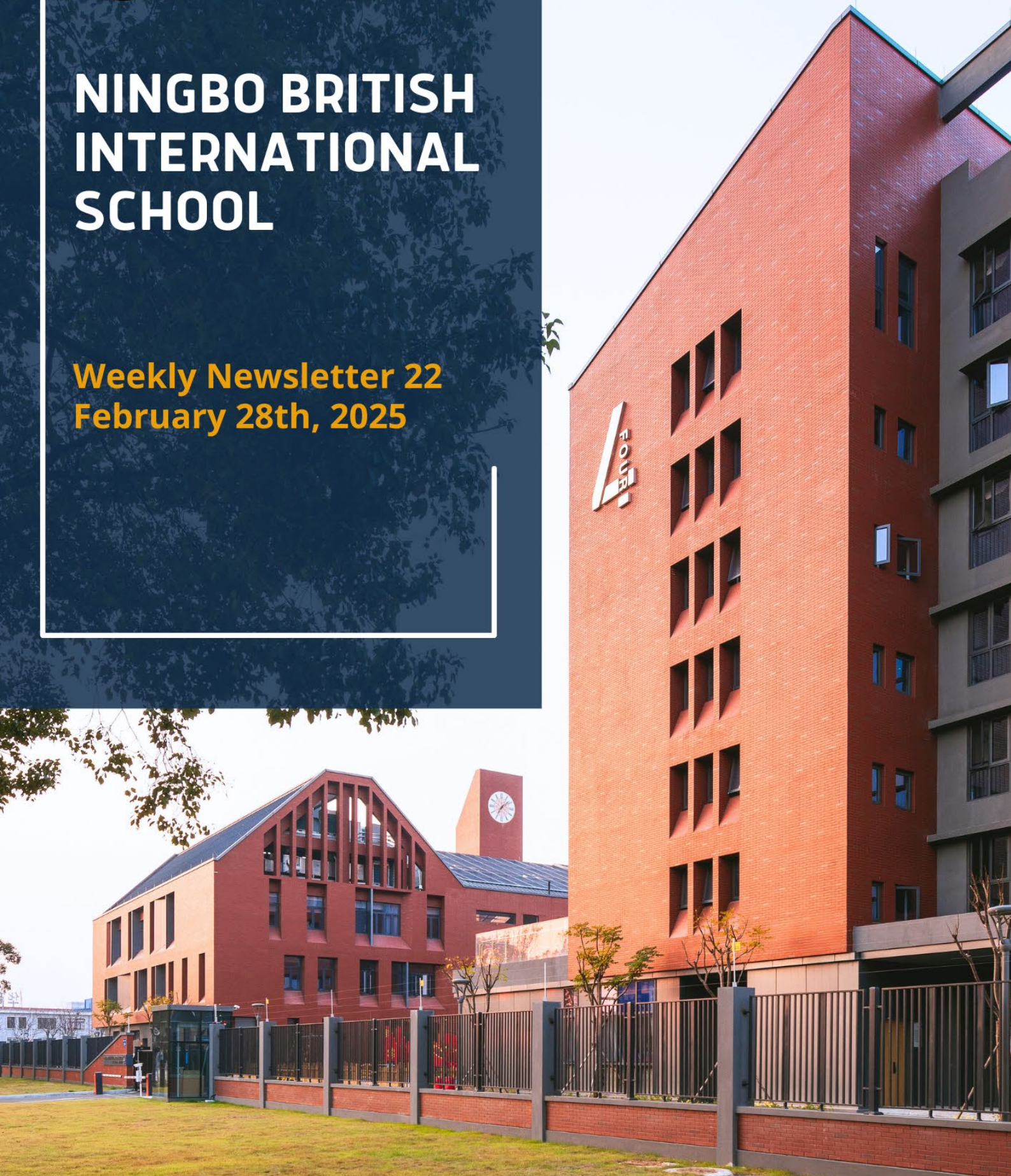

Strengthen Ties for Inclusive Education

NBIS welcomed ELG for a visit this week. ELG stands for Engage, Learn, Grow. They are based in Shanghai, serving the greater community's SEN needs. NBIS has referred some students to ELG to identify specific learning needs.

This collaboration has evolved since 2023, when Primary Inclusion teacher Miss Chrissy Loupos and Secondary Guidance Counselor Ms Chane Coetzee visited ELG's Shanghai, observing their holistic child-centered approach firsthand.



On Wednesday, Mr Phil and Miss Chrissy welcomed Ms Eva, ELG's Community Liaison Officer, Regina Nicolas Schaufelberger, ELG's director of services, a physical therapist and sensory integration specialist, and Ms Grace Shi, ELG's Education Partner Manager. We are proud to welcome them to NBIS to begin the foundational steps of a collaborative relationship with our school. We spoke about teachers' professional development, parents' workshops, and student engagement/referral. Our hope is to include the greater Ningbo community, with NBIS being the host location, for the wonderful services ELG provides.

We hope to see ELG representatives around in the future!



Dentist Visited



On Tuesday, February 25th, NBIS Early Years and Lower Primary students were pleased to welcome Dentist Mr Lai and his team for a routine dental check. In line with the section's focus on hygiene and self-care, Mr Lai demonstrated the tasks involved in his profession and, along with the nurses, provided students with valuable advice on maintaining proper oral care. Subsequent in-class discussions will emphasise the importance of incorporating teeth cleaning into daily routines. Our young learners enthusiastically thanked the dentist and nurses, rounding off a wonderful experience for all.

Spring is a season full of renewal, bright colours, and adventures. As the weather warms up and nature starts to bloom, our children explore the world around them through learning about plants, the life cycle of a flower, and seasonal changes.

Children love learning about how seeds grow into plants, and they experience this firsthand by planting their own flowers in small pots. They have so much fun filling the pots with soil, placing the seeds in the soil and covering them lightly. Afterwards, they water the seeds and begin to observe them daily, discussing their growth. As the plants grow, we can discuss the importance of sunshine, water, air, warmth, and soil in helping them thrive.



Dental health and teeth are another topic that we talk about this week. We have a dental health activity for literacy – **Build Smile Names**. The children always love anything that has to do with their names and their friends' names. They are required to colour the mouth, trace the letters, cut the small squares and rearrange the letters.

READ-A-THON

The NBIS Read-A-Thon will take place during the whole month of March.

It is your mission to read as many books as possible.

The books you read need to be level-appropriate. Your English teacher must sign off on each book and may ask you questions about it.

Your friends and family can sponsor the number of books you read.

Sponsors can pledge any monetary amount, e.g. 1RMB per book or a flat amount.

The reader is responsible for collecting the donations.

Your English teacher will collect donations from readers at the end of the month.

All proceeds will then be donated to a local animal charity.

MAKE A PLEDGE

Make a pledge to encourage reading and raise money for a local animal charity. The NBIS read-a-thon will take place between March 1st and March 31st, 2025.

There are two ways to pledge:

1. You could sponsor a student for a flat amount. If you pledge a flat donation of 20RMB, no matter how much the student reads, you will owe 20RMB.
2. You can pledge an amount for books read. For example, a student reads five books over the course of the read-a-thon. If you sponsored this student for 5RMB per book, you would owe $5 \times 5\text{RMB} = 25\text{RMB}$. You may limit any donation; just indicate that on the sponsor form.





HOW TO ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILDREN TO READ

Reading is an essential skill that children will use daily for the rest of their lives. While children learn to read at school, parents can enhance the experience by offering support at home. One way of doing this is to encourage your child to participate in the read-a-thon and check their reading progress.

Tips for parents:

- **Encourage your child to read level-appropriate books.** If a book is too difficult, your child might lose interest or think reading is too hard.
- **Listen to your child read out loud.** Point to difficult words as your child reads so you can check their understanding.
- **Relate the story to real life.** Talk to your child about the book they are reading and answer their questions about how it may be important to their lives.
- **Read more difficult books.** Challenge your child to read more difficult books once they are confident in reading.
- **Praise your child's reading and make reading time part of your family's daily routine.**

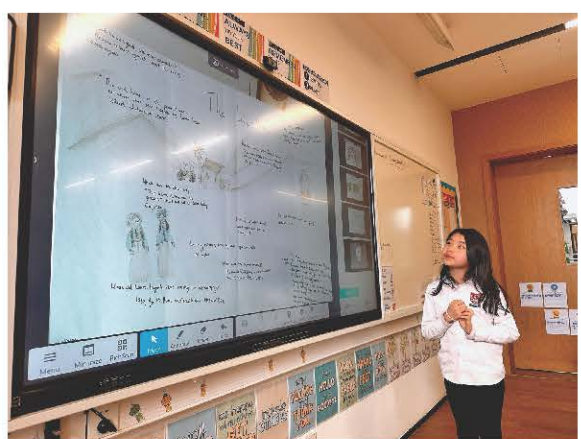
Research and Presentation Project

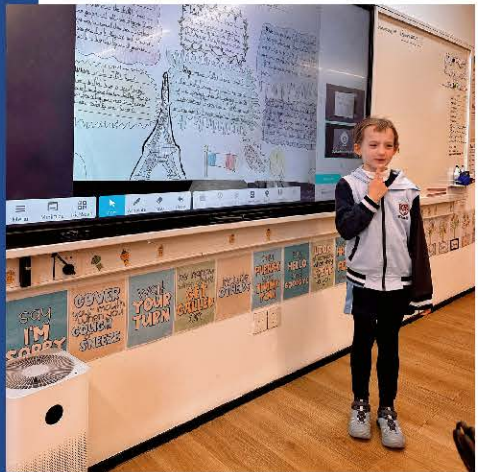

LEARNING SUPPORT

- Secondary Inclusion Team English Department

At NBIS, students are supported in various aspects and through different methods. As students arrive at NBIS with a range of English language levels, some may struggle with the language, therefore, **ESL-Support** will be provided to our students in many ways to ensure that their learning needs are met in a nurturing and supportive environment.



Push-In Support

In push-in support, ESL/ EAL students are assisted in their regular classrooms during lessons, particularly in content-heavy subjects like science. A teacher may sit or stand next to students who are struggling, providing real-time support to help them stay on task and follow the lesson. This support is offered without removing students from the classroom, ensuring they receive immediate help during class activities, discussions, and bookwork, which enhances their comprehension and engagement with the lesson content.



In pull-out sessions, students will work in smaller groups outside of their regular classes to receive more targeted support.

Bilingual Handouts

Bilingual handouts are provided to support students' understanding of course content. These handouts include commonly used basic English sight words, as well as subject-related vocabulary, phrases, and concepts, presented in both English and the students' native languages. This approach enhances students' comprehension of the lesson content and fosters better retention.

Drop-In Sessions

Drop-in sessions are available with Ms Fay during lunch breaks on Monday, Wednesday, and Thursday, offering students a flexible and informal opportunity for one-on-one support. During these sessions, questions are asked, content is clarified, personalised help is offered.



Individualised Education Plans (IEPs) & Assessment Reports

For students who require additional support, Individualised Education Plans (IEPs) and Assessment Reports are created as essential tools for analysing students' areas of need, identifying areas for improvement, and providing support strategies to subject teachers, homeroom teachers, and other relevant staff members to ensure a supportive learning environment.
