



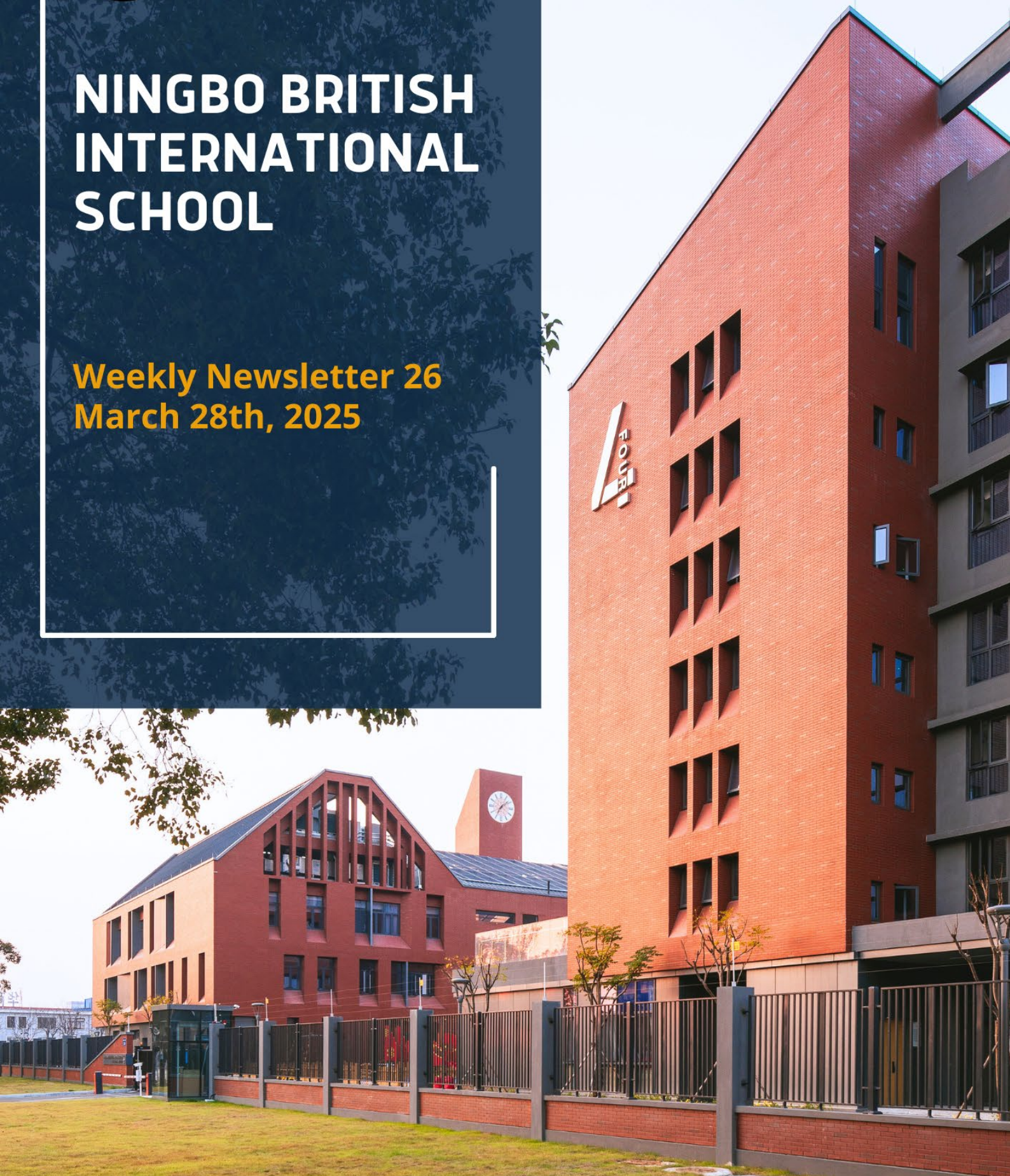

Student-Led Quizbowl Competition Success

An Interview with Tithi Muljani (Year 12)

On March 14th, two NBIS teams: Fermat's Last Team and The Thinkers - competed against GSN in the first NBIS and GSN Quizbowl. Demonstrating their knowledge across subjects like natural sciences, literature, sports, and pop culture, they won 1st and 2nd place in a four-team showdown. This event was entirely student-led, showcasing collaboration and initiative between NBIS and GSN students.



Q: Can you tell us how the idea for the Quizbowl competition came about?

Tithi: It all started when I met April, a Grade 12 student at GSN and the student council president. We both wanted to organise an event where NBIS and GSN students could meet for a friendly competition. Initially, we were unsure whether a debate competition or a Quizbowl would be the better choice. After gathering interest from students at both schools, we decided on a Quizbowl since it tested existing knowledge and was more engaging for participants and spectators alike.



Q: How did you go about organising the event?

Tithi: Once we received approval from both schools, April and I started planning. At NBIS, Mr Sean Armstrong and Arpitha from Year 12 offered their support due to their previous experience with Quizbowl tournaments. This helped us shape how we wanted to organise the event. We also had to construct questions, recruit participants, set up the competition structure, and prepare materials like a PowerPoint and a host script. Weekly calls helped us stay on track and refine our plans. We discussed the advancements we had made, and what else needed to be completed. Though the process was time-consuming, it was incredibly rewarding, as we got to apply our theoretical knowledge of the world to real life.

Q: How did you ensure fairness in the competition?



Tithi: To maintain confidentiality, everyone involved in writing the questions - April, Daniel, Arpitha and I - signed a contract ensuring that no answers would be leaked. This way, all participants had an equal chance to compete fairly.

Q: What was the experience like on the day of the event?

Tithi: We left NBIS at 12:15 with our 10 participants. Fermant's Last Team consisted of Dennis, Alyssa, Vanessa, Gabriel, and Mohammed, and The Thinkers consisted of Justin, Zaid, Maya, Charlie, and Biel. When we arrived at GSN, their students warmly welcomed us and led us to their auditorium. As the event was student-led, Daniel and I hosted, while Arpitha and April managed the buzzer and moderated the questions. It was an intense competition, but in the end, Fermant's Last Team took 1st place, with The Thinkers following in 2nd. Seeing students stand proudly on stage with their certificates was a moment of accomplishment for everyone.





Q: What was your biggest takeaway from organising this event?

Tithi: Organising the Quizbowl was an incredibly rewarding experience. It not only helped me develop my leadership, teamwork, and event management skills but also taught me the importance of networking with people beyond our school community. The support from our schools was invaluable, and I truly hope we can make this an annual event, allowing more students to benefit from this enriching opportunity.

Q: What advice would you give to other students who want to organise similar inter-school events?

Tithi: Having a consistent plan/timeline you stick to while organising, so you have a clear vision of what the event will look like. Keeping in consistent relations with the other school, and making sure the event is something you are passionate about and can motivate yourself to complete, is also incredibly important.

The success of this Quizbowl is just the beginning. By fostering collaboration and strengthening ties between schools, student-led events like these pave the way for even more exciting opportunities ahead.

Promoting Fine Motor Skills in Preschool

Fine motor skills refer to the ability to use small muscles, particularly those in the hands and fingers, to perform tasks that require precision and coordination. In preschool-aged children, fine motor skill development is crucial because it lays the foundation for later abilities in reading, writing, self-care, and problem-solving.

What's fine motor skills ?



In Preschool, we incorporate various daily activities to help children develop a better grip on small objects. Over the last few weeks, our Preschoolers has been busy engaging in the following activities.





Drawing and Coloring

They have begun drawing basic shapes, lines, and figures (such as circles and squares).



Cutting with Scissors



They start learning to use scissors safely to cut along straight and curved lines.





Stacking

This activity enhances both hand control and problem-solving abilities.



Manipulating Small Objects



They learn to manipulate smaller objects, such as beads, coins, or buttons, which helps improve their pincer grasp (the ability to hold objects with the thumb and index finger).



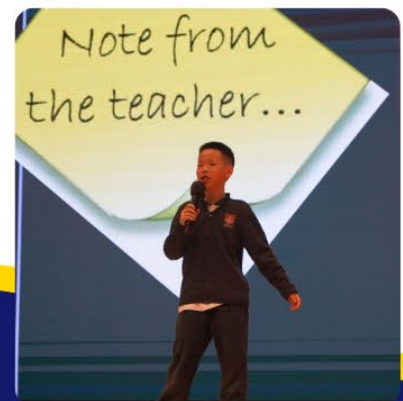
Threading Beads

This exercise encourages the pincer grasp and improves focus.

Within this week's upper Primary Assembly, Year 5A students showcased the importance of using patience every day. 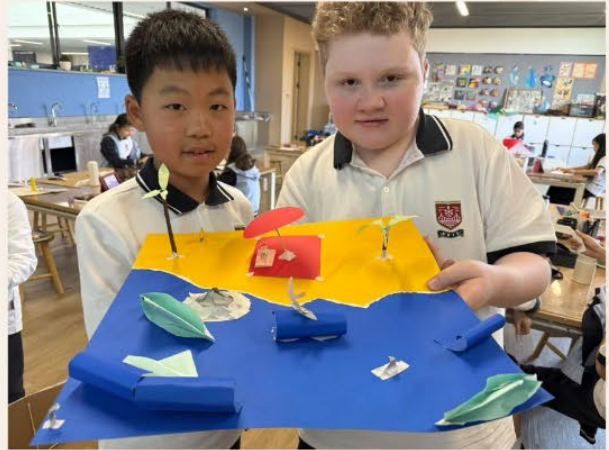
This week, our students have been busy exploring their artistic talents across different year groups!

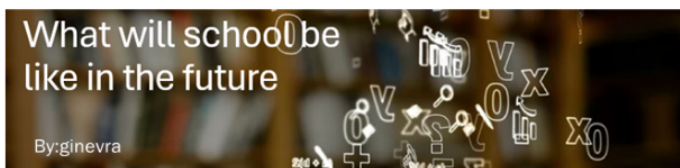
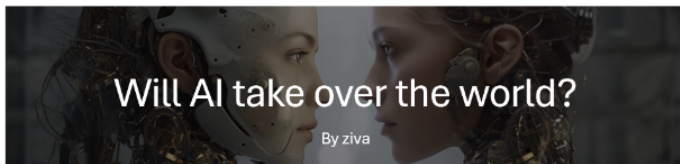
Global Perspectives

In Lower Secondary, Global Perspectives develops the skills of research, analysis, evaluation, reflection, collaboration and communication. The curriculum provides pressing humanities issues – in the form of challenges – as a lens through which to develop these skills.

Year 8 Challenge: Letters to the Future

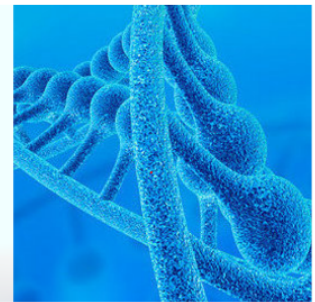
Year 8's current challenge is 'Looking at the future', requiring them to research and analyse science and technology breakthroughs in the present that may influence the future. The work has seen them make predictions based on their research, evaluating the sources they find and communicating their ideas via presentations, written tasks and suitable graphics.



Alongside their predictions, they are also reflecting on life in 2025, writing a letter to the future about the best aspects of life in the today's world. Many are choosing the convenience of life today and the access to food from around the globe. Quite a number were surprised to learn, through research, that many large multi-national fast-food brands entered China in the 1990s and 2000s, believing them to have been here for decades before this.

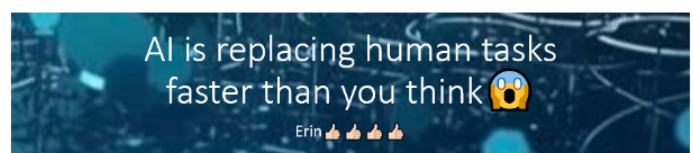
Other areas being explored include the wide access to books, the ease and price of travel and access to entertainment from around the globe available at their fingertips.

Year 9 Challenge: 'Sports for All'

Meanwhile, Year 9 are working towards making NBIS a more accessible place, with a particular focus on access to sports. Their challenge, 'Sports for All', asks them to look at the school and make recommendations on how access to sports could be changed or improved. As part of this, they have analysed and evaluated the existing situation at NBIS, through undertaking an accessibility survey, in which some were blindfolded and others were in wheelchairs. It was hoped that through simulating some access restrictions, they may discover more than they thought they would – which was certainly the case!



Next, they worked collaboratively to develop a survey for the NBIS student body to complete, giving their thoughts on sports within the school. Very shortly they will be presenting their findings and recommendations in the final graded piece of work for this challenge.

ATHLETICS DAY

Last Thursday, March 20th, Secondary section hosted most anticipated Athletics Day for Y7-10 students.

Same as last year, students were divided into two groups based on their age – Y7 & 8 and Y9 & 10, those groups were further split based on a gender. This ensures competitions are as fair as possible across all disciplines and students can showcase their skills, talent and dedication.

Throws: Javelin and Shot Put

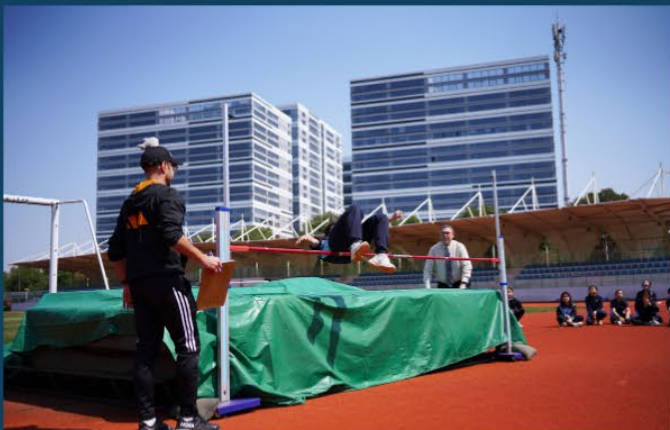
Jumps: Long jump and High Jump

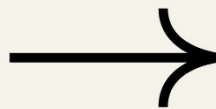
