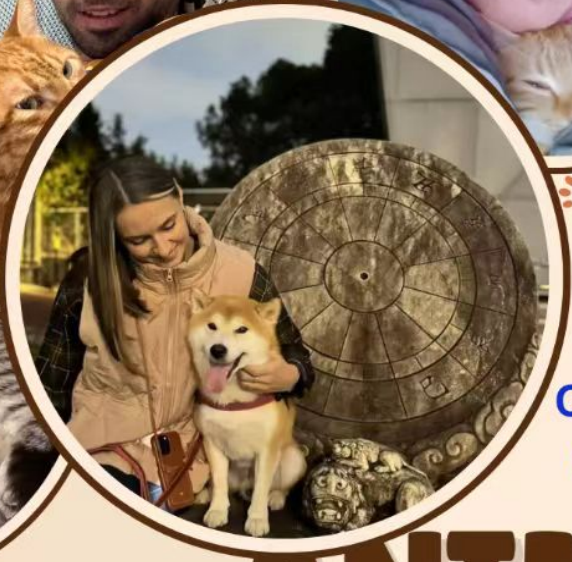

Enhancing Campus Safety

Anti-Terror Training and Fire Drill Conducted Successfully

Campus safety is a shared responsibility, and prevention is always our priority. To further strengthen safety measures across our school, NBIS recently conducted key safety exercises.

On November 20, Police officer Zhou Haifeng, our Vice Principal of Legal Affairs, was present for an anti-terrorism training session provided to our campus security team.

During the training, Police officer Chen Weibin, Team Leader of the Patrol Unit at Juxian Police Station, provided a detailed explanation on the proper use of protective equipment such as riot shields and steel batons. He also demonstrated coordinated tactics for neutralizing threats, aiming to enhance the operational readiness of our first line of defense on campus.



Following the instructions, our security guards formed three-person teams to conduct practical drills. This hands-on exercise significantly improved their ability to respond effectively to potential violent incidents.

Additionally, on November 18, a fire drill was conducted among boarding students and staff to reinforce safety awareness and emergency response capabilities. The evacuation of all residents to safety was completed in just 4 minutes. The exercise was orderly and well-coordinated, demonstrating effective emergency preparedness.

Fire Safety Tips:

- Keep science lab equipment away from flammable materials.
- Do not use personal gas cookers or hot plates in classrooms or dormitories.
- Keep classroom corridors and exits clear – never block fire routes.
- Know the nearest fire extinguisher and how to use it.



Electrical Safety Tips

- Do not overload sockets with too many devices.
- Keep wet hands away from switches or plugs.
- Report damaged wires or sparking sockets to teachers or maintenance staff immediately.
- Switch off and unplug devices (such as projectors or computers) after lessons.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:



We share stories in small groups, using puppets and props to bring them to life. We listen to a wide range of sounds, songs, and rhymes to sharpen listening skills.



We ask open-ended questions about stories like, "what do you think will happen next?" or "How do you think this character feels?"

LITERACY:



We encourage children to re-tell familiar stories in their own words and to describe the pictures they see.



Sharing a story is a wonderful bonding experience. It helps children understand their own feelings and the feelings of others, building empathy as they discuss the characters' adventures.



Our cosy book corner is a favourite spot! they enjoy independently exploring books, carefully holding them and turning the pages forwards and backwards. "

To everyone's delight, the surprises were hidden in Mr Robert's and Mr Simon's offices!

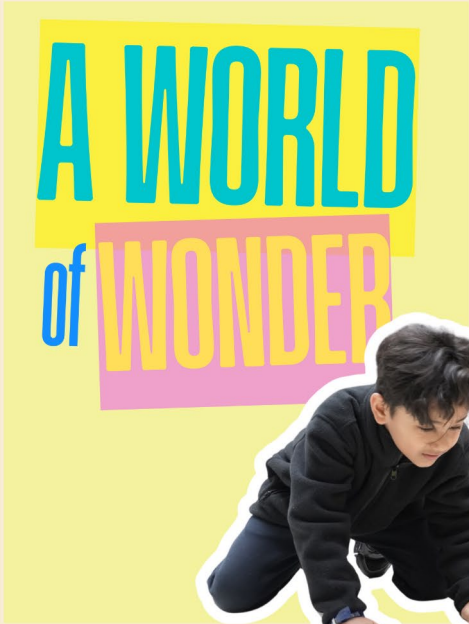

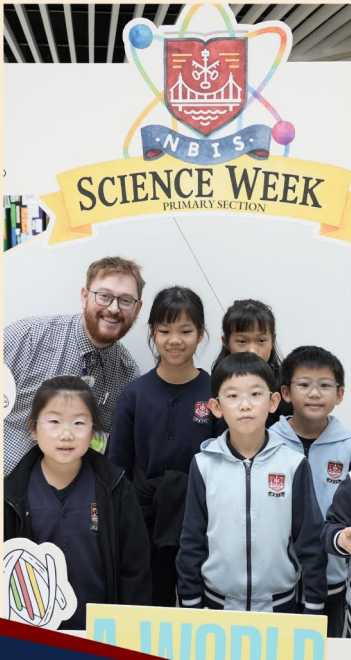

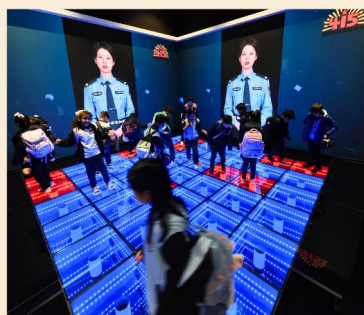

HKU brings AI-powered future to NBIS: Senior manager outlines "AI in every course" and new global degrees



25 Nov 2025 – Ms Zorian Wong, Senior Programme Manager in the HKU Admissions Office, flew into Ningbo British International School (NBIS) to deliver the city's first on-campus briefing on The University of Hong Kong's 2026 undergraduate intake.

Speaking to Year 10-13 students and parents, Ms Wong announced that—starting next September—HKU will embed AI literacy modules in all 55+ bachelor's programmes, from Medicine and Law to Arts and Social Sciences. "It doesn't matter whether you read Education or Civil Engineering," she told the audience.

"You will leave HKU fluent in data, ethics and generative-AI tools, because that is what tomorrow's workplaces expect."



New departments & interdisciplinary degrees

- Department of Biomedical Engineering – joint with the Faculty of Medicine and Faculty of Engineering; students can minor in AI-for-Health or Robotics-for-Surgery
- Bachelor of Arts in Global Creative Industries – taught in English, blending media, design, business, and technology; mandatory AI-content-creation studio and a semester at HKU's new London Centre
- 100 minors campus-wide – pair any major (from FinTech to Climate Science) with minors such as Digital Heritage, Psychology of AI, or Entrepreneurial Bio-design

5-year "Bachelor+Master" global programme

- 1 HKU bachelor's degree
- 1 bachelor's degree from the partner campus (Cambridge, UCB or PKU)
- 1 master's degree from HKU—all within five years

Students spend Years 1-2 in Hong Kong, Years 3-4 at the partner campus, and return to HKU for a final master's year.

18-month Zhangjiang Programme + 6-month hi-tech internship

The audience's biggest applause came for the Zhangjiang (Shanghai) Programme. Selected HKU undergraduates spend three academic semesters (1.5 years) taking advanced STEM, AI, and innovation courses at HKU's Zhangjiang research hub, then complete a six-month paid internship with flagship high-tech firms such as SMIC, Huawei, or Baidu AI Cloud. Participants graduate with both HKU credit and a Shanghai municipal certificate in "AI & Deep Technology", all while paying standard Hong Kong tuition.

Flagship Exchanges

Exchange remains a headline attraction. HKU's flagship semester exchanges are with 433 exchange partners in 49 destinations, including Cambridge, Oxford, MIT, Princeton, Yale, etc.



Q&A sparks

Questions from NBIS students and parents covered topics ranging from admission cut-offs and visa regulations to campus hall life.

Applications for the 2026 intake open on 24 September 2025 and close on 21 August 2026, but Ms Wong urged NBIS applicants to submit before noon on 26 November 2025 in the first round for greater opportunities.

Language convenience & NBIS curriculum alignment

Ms Zorian Wong was impressed by the English Proficiency and holistic development of students from NBIS. Students who achieve IGCSE English as a First Language grade B (or above) or an A Level C (or above) in English Literature/Language may apply for a waiver of IELTS/TOEFL and use their in-school English profile as proof of language proficiency for HKU admission.

NBIS candidates normally sit 3-4 A Level subjects, meeting HKU's minimum requirement of "three A Levels for application". Such as school events, academic projects, competitions, ECA clubs, and community services can all be helpful to boost competitiveness.



Ms Zorian Wong said HKU will return to NBIS for more information sessions and invited NBIS students to join the HKU taster programme to explore more about HKU.

"Today's talk is only the beginning," added Ms Jill Lu, NBIS University Guidance counsellor. "We are building a long-term partnership with HKU and will bring more of the world's top universities to campus."

Mr Yassine had this to say about Mohammed, who helped run the trip. *"Mohammed successfully organised and managed the entire event. His involvement ranged from students' guidance and management, liaising between venue staff and everyone else, translating from Chinese to English for the various activities, and taking care of the necessary on the bus head count in the return trip."*

She worked with group members to produce advertising videos and a detailed presentation to promote the trip and encourage participation. She invited participants to join the group chat to facilitate smoother communication. In addition, she prepared event-related gifts that were very well received and provided support to group members who needed assistance."
