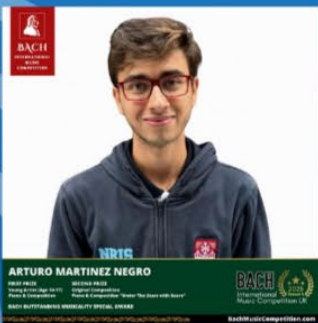

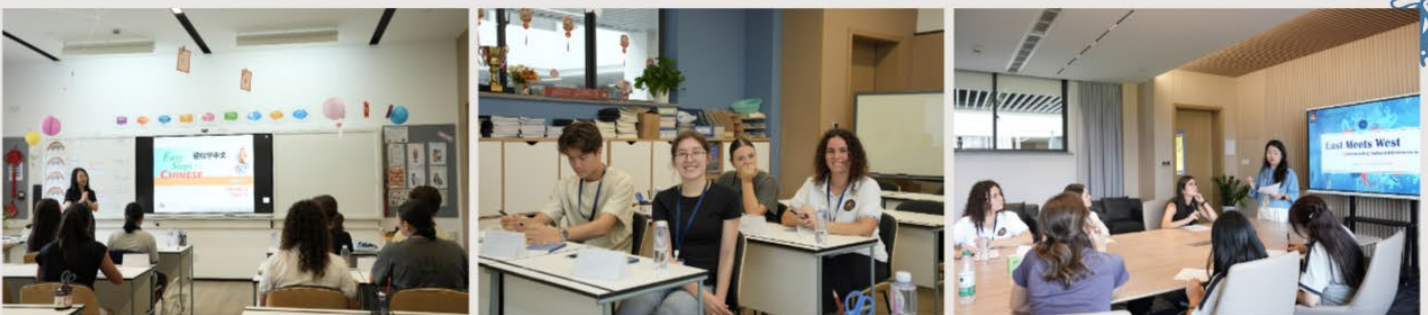
- **A Journey of Language and Culture at NBIS**

- **Beyond Language: A Trinity Approach**

Moving past conventional language training, our programme integrates core communication skills, cultural insight, and hands-on practice. Students progressed from everyday conversations to exploring the philosophy behind Chinese traditions — truly experiencing China in multiple dimensions.



• A Tapestry of Cultural Discovery

Each week brought a new theme in our cultural appreciation class.



Learned the legend of the Mid-Autumn Festival and expressed nostalgia through song and gesture.

Experienced the respect embodied in the Chongyang Festival by making Ningbo's traditional Jintuan (金团) rice cakes.

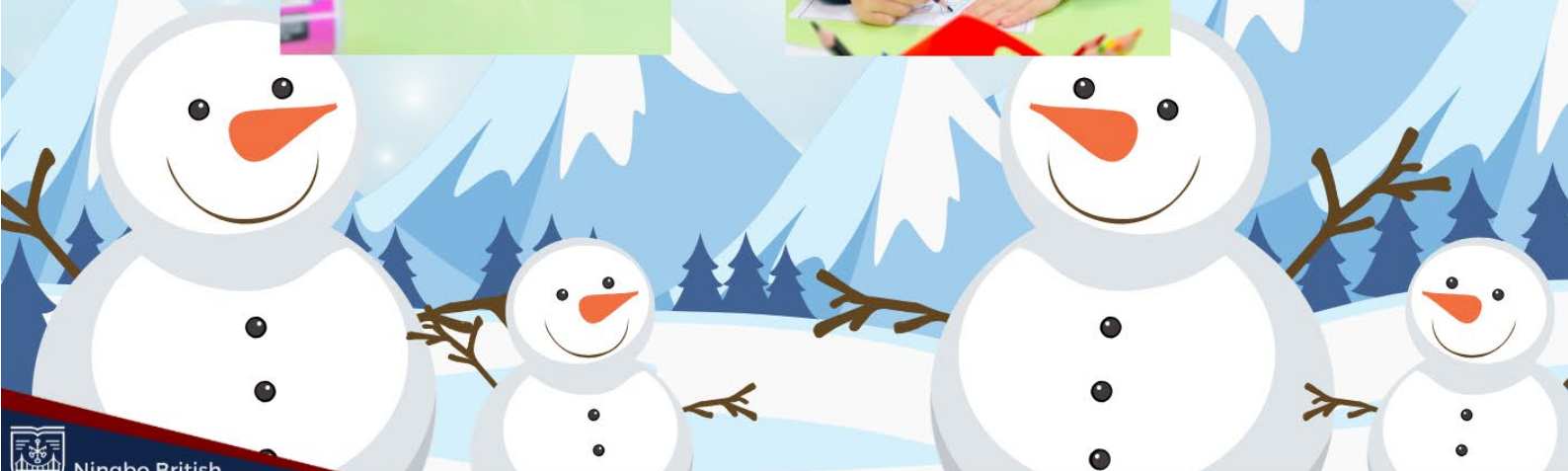

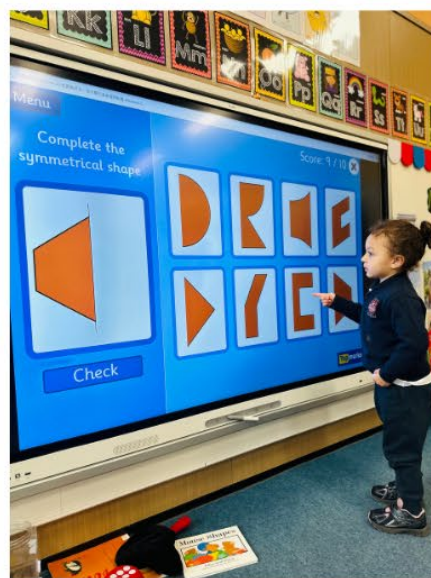
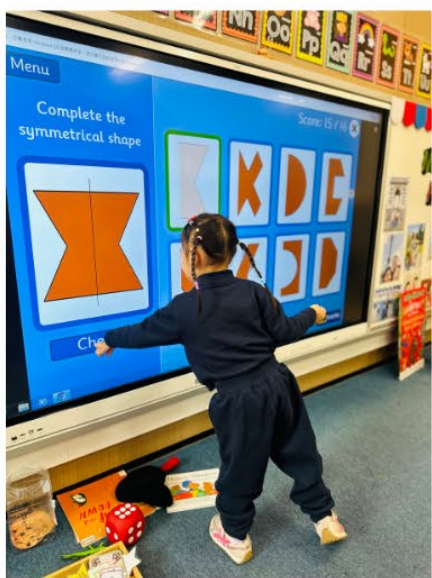

We've been learning the concept of symmetry and children had the opportunity to play a new game and find the corresponding shape to make the mirror image!



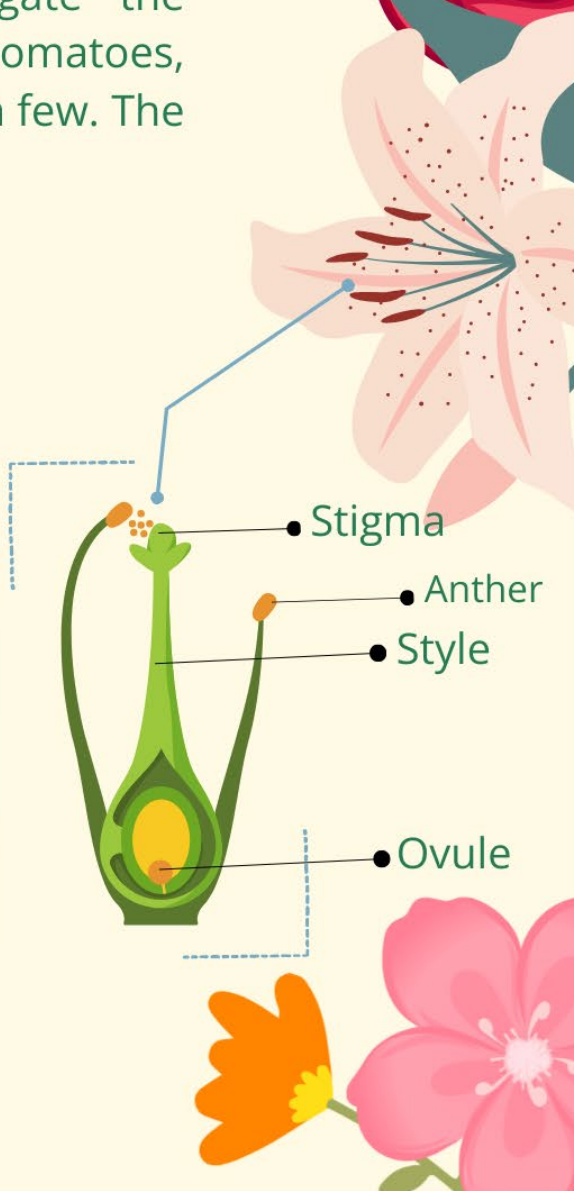

ART OF THE WEEK

Upcoming Art Projects

In the upcoming Art & Design unit, Year 7 students will explore the exciting theme of Pattern and Texture, in line with the Cambridge Lower Secondary Art & Design curriculum. This unit is designed to help students develop their visual understanding, creativity, and confidence through hands-on experimentation and observation.

Students will investigate how patterns can be created, repeated, and varied, and how texture can be suggested or physically created using a range of materials and techniques. Through drawing, mark making, and mixed-media work, students will learn how artists use pattern and texture to add interest, depth, and meaning to their artwork.

Key Aims

In line with the Cambridge curriculum, the unit places strong emphasis on:

- Exploring materials, tools, and techniques
- Developing observational and recording skills
- Making creative choices and taking risks
- Reflecting on and improving work through feedback

Students will also be encouraged to look at the work of artists and designers from different cultures and contexts who use pattern and texture in distinctive ways. This will help them understand how visual elements communicate ideas and how art connects to the wider world.

By the end of the unit, Year 7 students will produce a final artwork that demonstrates their understanding of pattern and texture, showing evidence of experimentation, thoughtful development, and personal expression. The project aims to foster curiosity, independence, and enjoyment of the creative process while building strong foundations for future learning in Art & Design.



ART OF THE WEEK

Upcoming Art Projects

In the upcoming Art & Design unit, Year 8 students will explore the theme of The Built Environment, in line with the Cambridge Lower Secondary Art & Design curriculum. This unit focuses on how artists, designers, and architects respond to buildings, spaces, and structures, and how the environments we create shape our everyday experiences.

A key component of the unit is lino printing, where students will learn how to design, carve, and print their own relief prints inspired by architectural imagery. They will explore positive and negative space, pattern, and repetition while developing technical skills and an understanding of printmaking processes. In addition, students will create 2D architectural structures using cardboard and fabric, exploring how materials can be manipulated to represent form, texture, and structural detail. By layering, cutting, folding, and assembling materials

Key Aims

In line with the Cambridge curriculum, the unit emphasises:

- Experimentation with materials, tools, and techniques
- Developing technical skills alongside creative exploration
- Understanding visual elements such as line, form, texture, and pattern
- Reflecting on feedback to refine and improve work

By the end of the unit, Year 8 students will produce a final outcome that demonstrates a clear understanding of the built environment, combining printmaking and constructed materials to communicate architectural ideas. The project aims to develop confidence, problem-solving skills, and independent thinking while strengthening students' ability to make informed creative choices within Art & Design.
