Celebrating Chinese Culture Day Bringing the Maritime Silk Road to Life

This past week, NBIS was transformed. Not by props or decorations alone, but by the energy, curiosity, and pride of our students and staff. Our annual Chinese Culture Day unfolded like a journey—one that took us across centuries, along coastlines, and into the heart of a shared story. From art to performance, from hands-on discovery to quiet moments of reflection, it was a day when history felt alive, and culture became something we created together.

Art & Calligraphy Exhibition: The Four Arts in Full Display



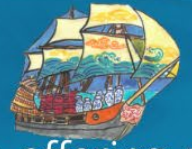
The festivities began quietly, in the staff lounge, where nearly a hundred student artworks lined the walls. Here, in three thoughtful sections—the Year of the Horse, the Maritime Silk Road, and Art Class Highlights—young artists shared not just their skills, but their voices.



The opening ceremony brought together the timeless “four arts 四艺” of Chinese culture: music, chess, calligraphy, and painting 琴棋书画. In that space, there was a rare stillness—a moment where tradition was not taught, but felt.



Cultural Marketplace: A Journey Along the Maritime Silk Road



If the exhibition was a quiet beginning, the Cultural Marketplace was a vibrant awakening. Twelve booths lined the fairground, each offering a different doorway into the past and present. Some hands shaped porcelain, others carefully tied prayer knots or pieced together model ships. Nearby, drones hummed through the air, and digital robotics sparked wide-eyed wonder. Dressed in traditional Chinese attire, students and teachers moved from booth to booth, trading with special coins, listening to music from lands along the Maritime Silk Road. They tasted unfamiliar flavours, collected treasures from the bazaar, and, in doing so, walked a path once travelled by merchants, sailors, and dreamers. By the end of the day, over 600 visitors had passed through—not as spectators, but as participants in a living story.





Cultural Show: Setting Sail with AI and Tradition

As the afternoon light softened, the auditorium came alive with a different kind of energy. The performances filled the space with music, movement, and moments of quiet brilliance.



Secondary students took the stage with skits, song medleys, rap, martial arts, and instrumental pieces—each performance a reflection of their courage and creativity. A particularly tender moment came with the teacher-student duet *Slow, Slow Song*, a melody that seemed to pause time itself. Meanwhile, our youngest performers took us on a journey of their own: the large-scale group dances of the primary students, *Setting Sail* and *Triumphant Return*, swept across the stage like waves. For the first time, we also brought AI into the production—not as a novelty, but as a bridge. Through it, classrooms connected with the ancient Silk Road, and students came to understand, in a deeply personal way, the wisdom and history behind these thousand-year-old paths.

From the Classroom to the World

Two weeks before Chinese Culture Day, a lecture on the Maritime Silk Road had already planted the first seeds. When the day itself arrived, those seeds began to bloom. Ningbo, once known as Mingzhou, was where this great maritime journey once began.



And in our school, that history stepped out of textbooks and into the hands, hearts, and imaginations of our students. Guided by the mission of the Chinese Department—To Know China, To Be a Friend of China, To Love China—we strive not only to teach, but to connect. Between cultures, between generations, between the stories we carry and the ones we are still writing.



This day reminded us that culture is not something we inherit passively—it is something we create together, every time we share a story, try a new craft, or cheer for a classmate on stage. It is in these moments that we see each other clearly, across differences, across backgrounds, and across the many paths that brought us to this same school. Chinese Culture Day was never just an event. It was a conversation across centuries, a gathering of hearts, and a quiet reminder that when we make space for each other's stories, we become something greater than the sum of our parts.

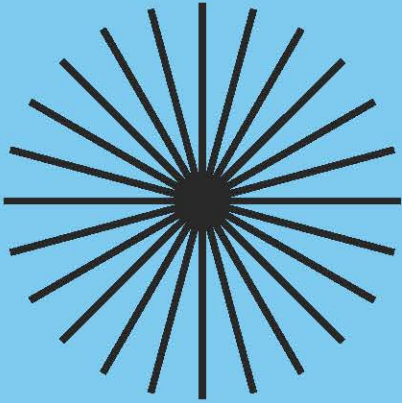

ABOUT THE READ-A-THON

The Secondary Read-A-Thon will take place from March 9th to April 9th.

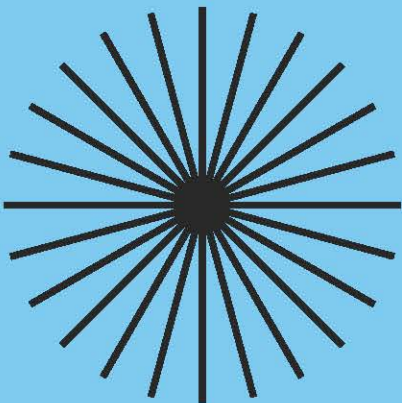


The secondary students have been challenged to read as many books as possible while raising money for a community animal charity. Students can collect sponsors for every book they read for the read-a-thon.



Friends and family can sponsor the number of books students read. Sponsors can pledge any monetary amount, e.g., 1 RMB per book or a flat amount. The reader is responsible for collecting the donations.

The books read need to be level-appropriate. English teachers must sign off on each book.



All proceeds will then be donated to a local animal charity called 'Stray Don't Cry'- an active charity that provides care to abandoned pets in Ningbo.

MAKE A PLEDGE

Pledge to encourage reading and raise money for a local animal charity. The NBIS read-a-thon will take place between March 9th and April 9th, 2026.

There are two ways to pledge:

1. You could sponsor a student for a flat amount. If you pledge a flat donation of 20RMB, no matter how much the student reads, you will owe 20RMB.
2. You can pledge an amount for books read. For example, a student reads five books over the course of the read-a-thon. If you sponsored this student for 5RMB per book, you would owe $5 \times 5\text{RMB} = 25\text{RMB}$. You may limit any donation; just indicate that on the sponsor form.



THE READ-A-THON IS CONTINUING THROUGH MARCH HERE ARE SOME TIPS ON HOW TO ENCOURAGE YOUR CHILDREN TO READ

Reading is an essential skill that children will use daily for the rest of their lives. While children learn to read at school, parents can enhance the experience by offering support at home. One way of doing this is to encourage your child to participate in the read-a-thon and check their reading progress.

Tips for parents:

- **Encourage your child to read level-appropriate books.** If a book is too difficult, your child might lose interest or think reading is too hard.
- **Listen to your child read out loud.** Point to difficult words as your child reads so you can check their understanding.
- **Relate the story to real life.** Talk to your child about the book they are reading and answer their questions about how it may be important to their lives.
- **Read more difficult books.** Challenge your child to read more difficult books once they are confident in reading.
- **Praise your child's reading and make reading time part of your family's daily routine.**

- Don't: ride against traffic, ride side by side, carry passengers, ride one-handed, or use headphones

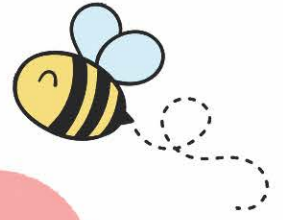

RECEPTION A

Celebrating SPRING



Over the past few weeks, Reception A has focused on welcoming the spring season. We began by reviewing the changes that occur during this season, and the children enjoyed discussing what they would see, including flowers blooming, leaves returning to the trees, and lots of bees!

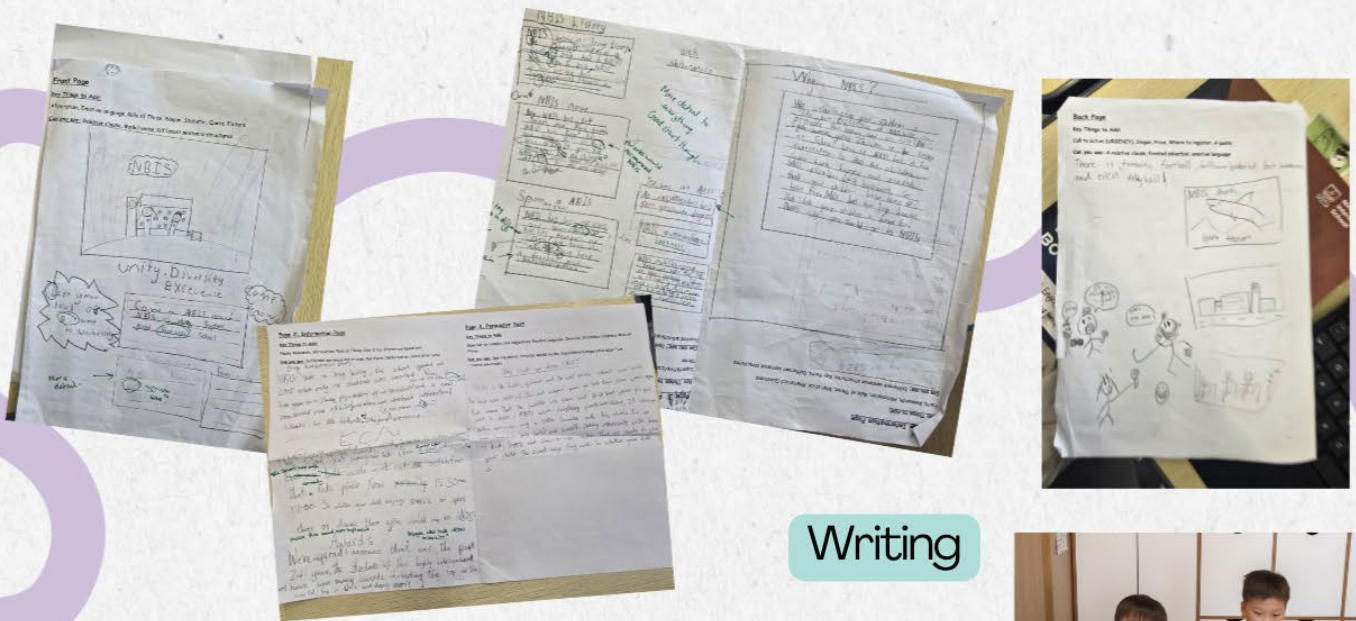


5A Persuasive Leaflets

Planning

To begin, the students chose what to create a leaflet about. Some students chose to write about NBIS and some decided to create leaflets about a celebrity or an event. Once they had decided what they were writing about, they reflected on what makes the school or their event so special. From there, we focused on **AFOREST** persuasive skills — **A**lliteration, **F**acts, **O**pinions, **R**hetorical Questions, **E**motive Language, **S**imiles, and the Rule of **T**hree—to persuade parents to send their children to NBIS.



Writing

Once planning was complete, the students developed their first drafts. We emphasised different sentence structures, superlative and comparative adjectives, and honed in on emotive language and how to build a sense of urgency. Throughout the process, we completed shared writes to share ideas and develop a better understanding of how to incorporate the new sentence structures and techniques into our writing. We also used AI to bring some of the leaflets alive.



PRIMARY ART OF THE WEEK

As the weather warms, our Year 1 and 2 pupils have been celebrating the season by exploring the work of Wu Guanzhong (1919–2010), one of China’s most celebrated modern artists. Known for blending Eastern ink traditions with Western abstract styles, Wu captured the spirit of a landscape with simple, expressive brushwork.



YEAR 4 STUDY VAN GOGH'S SUNFLOWERS



This term, Year 4 have been learning about the celebrated Dutch post-impressionist artist Vincent van Gogh. Renowned for his bold use of colour and expressive brushwork, Van Gogh created some of the most recognisable still-life paintings in art history, including his famous series of sunflowers. Inspired by these iconic works, the children created their own vibrant sunflower compositions using oil pastels. Working with yellow and blue as their base colours, they skilfully explored techniques of blending and layering to achieve rich gradients and depth. The results are a wonderful testament to their growing artistic confidence and understanding of colour.



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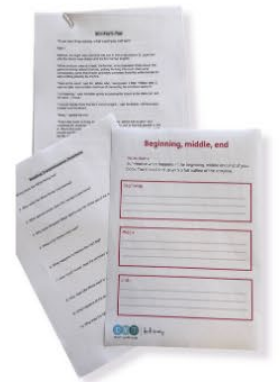
